History of Groundhog's Day


Craze Dates Back to Weather in 1886 & Need for Hope



Sun on Groundhog Day heralds another six weeks (42 days) of cold and winter. Cloudy weather gives observers the hope for an early spring. According to History.com "The first Groundhog Day celebration in Punxsutawney was the brainchild of local newspaper editor Clymer Freas, who sold a group of businessmen and groundhog hunters - known collectively as the Punxsutawney Groundhog Club—on the idea. 

(V): What does a typical day look like on the hill for you?

(RM): Mornings start at 6am. I am the newest voice for the Holiday Valley snow report! I write the snow report and record it for the snow phone (699-2644). Then I hop on the sled and head out to check on the parks. We rake snow and check all the features. On event days, we coordinate timing, set gates, and inspect the course, anything from alpine to freestyle to marketing events (Penguin Paddle, Winter Carnival etc). My day typically ends around 3pm.

(V): What do you enjoy in your time off the hill?
