Summer Music Festival Expands

The BPO Teams Up with Strange Music for This Year's Summer Music Festival



ELLCOTTVILLE - Ellicottville continues its long-standing tradition of hosting the Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra (BPO) during its annual Summer Music Festival. This year's performance is set to take place Sunday evening, July 3rd on the slopes of Holiday Valley. This will be the BPO's 28th Summer Music Fest engagement, and for 2022's venue, they have an extra special stage presence in the works.

Strange Magic - A Tribute to Electric Light Orchestra (ELO) will join the BPO for a showcase of highly trained musical talent that will surely deliver a sound like no other. Guest conductor Ron Spigelman of the Fort Worth Symphony will lead the evening's concert as they perform some of ELO's top hits from the past. The evening will conclude with everyone's favorite 1812 Overture and Stars and Stripes forever, choreographed to a majestic fireworks extravaganza in honor of America's birthday.

"We are ecstatic to have two highly orchestrated groups come together for one special night that families of all ages can enjoy," said Brian

McFadden, executive director of the Ellicottville Chamber of Commerce. "To have the Buffalo Philharmonic paired with one of the world's greatest tribute bands ... we can't wait to hear them together! It will be dynamite!"

Indeed, Strange Magic is nothing less than dynamite. The band was chosen to represent ELO on the AXS TV show, "The World's Greatest Tribute Bands" in 2017 (the same year that key members of the original ELO were inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame). The concert was broadcast live across the nation from the world famous "Whiskey a Go Go" in Hollywood, California. Now performing at theaters and outdoor venues across the country, Strange Magic delivers the sound and spectacle of a classic ELO show! Not only do they sound just like ELO, but the band members even LOOK like the original cast!

Not familiar with ELO? Surely, you've heard a few of their songs over the years ... Electric Light Orchestra is an English rock band that formed in Birmingham in 1970 by songwriters and multi-instrumentalists Jeff Lynne

and Roy Wood with drummer Bev Bevan. Their music is characterized by a fusion of pop, classical arrangements and futuristic iconography. During the 1970s and 1980s, ELO released a string of top 10 albums and singles, including two LPs that reached the top of British charts: the disco-inspired Discovery (1979) and the science-fiction-themed concept album Time (1981). Some of their biggest hits from over the years include 'Mr. Blue Sky', 'Livin' Thing', 'Evil Woman', 'Do Ya', and of course, 'Strange Magic'.

Want to pack in more music during your holiday weekend in Ellicottville? On Saturday, July 2nd, The Voices of Classic Rock will take the stage at Holiday Valley. Rock out to the sounds of Practically Petty - a Tribute to Tom Petty, who will open for Asia featuring John Payne, with special guests John Elefante, former lead singer of Kansas, and Lou Gramm, founder and former lead singer of Foreigner. Whoah! That is a LOT of music, making this year's July 4th weekend in Ellicottville one you'll want to book NOW!

Pre-sale tickets for Saturday's "Voices of Classic Rock" and Sunday's BPO featuring Strange Magic are on sale and can be purchased through the Chamber's website, ellicottvillenyc.com. Tickets are \$45 for each evening if purchased before June 1st. (Price bump takes effect June 1st, with the final price increase at the gate.). Kids 12 and under are free to attend.

All The Details You Need to Get Ready for Ellicottville's Event of the Summer

Holiday Valley, the Ellicottville Chamber of Commerce, and our valued partners are committed to providing all guests with a safe, clean, comfortable, and enjoyable concert experience inside and outside the facility. We strive to promote responsible behavior and make the fan experience family friendly, memorable, and positive for fans of all ages. Under no circumstance will any kind of irresponsible conduct be tolerated; some cases may result in ejection from the premises, revocation of ticket privileges, and/or arrest. Everyone deserves the right to enjoy the excitement and enthusiasm of concert days. Please treat all fans with courtesy and respect.

FAQ'S: Q: What can I bring in with me? Picnic baskets, coolers, chairs are allowed. All we ask is that you take with you everything that you brought to the concert. Trash receptacles are available, please use them. Cameras (non-professional only; no detachable lenses)

Items not allowed on the grounds: Weapons of any kind, Illegal drugs/substances, Laser pointers,

Animals (except service animals), Fireworks, Grills, cooking equipment, Remote controlled devices and Bicycles, skateboards, rollerblades etc.

Q: Are tickets available at the gate? Yes, cash or credit/debit cards are accepted, there is also an ATM on site.

Q: Where is ticket will call? Will call is at the entrance to the event.

Q: What is the cost of parking? Parking is free in the lots at the resort and are within a short walk.

Q: Can I leave and re-enter the concert area? No, there is no re-entry allowed, so be sure to bring everything you need. It can get cool when the sun goes down, so you may wish to bring a sweater or blanket.

Q: What is included with the VIP package? Please go to www.ellicottvillenyc.com and log onto Summer Music Festival to see the details.

Q: If I order presale tickets, how will I get them and when can I expect them? Tickets will be mailed within two weeks of receipt of your order.

Q: Is the venue handicapped accessible? Yes, it is. Security at the vehicle entrance will

direct you to handicap parking lot.

Q: Are there restroom facilities? Portable restrooms and hand wash stations are provided, including handicap accessible.

Q: Are there rain dates for the concerts? There are no rain dates and no refunds.

Q: What's the seating arrangement for the concert venue? Unless you have a VIP pass, the lawn is general admission. (Lawn chairs are welcome!)

Q: Are there concessions inside the gate? Yes, food and beverage concessions are immediately inside the main gate.

Q: What time to gates open? Gates open at 5pm for both Saturday and Sunday.

Q: Is medical assistance available? If someone has a medical emergency or requires special attention, seek concert security at the gates or in front of the stage. Medical staff and an ambulance will also be available near the concession stand adjacent to the entry gates.

Q: What is the smoking policy? A designated smoking section is provided to the right of the stage.

Holiday Valley's Sky High Adventure Park

New York State's Largest Aerial Park Opens for the Season, May 6th, 2022

Did you know that Holiday Valley has the third largest (in the U.S.) aerial park right in our backyard? You can swing through the trees on the Tarzan swing, climb up the cargo net, and challenge yourself on the thirteen different courses the park has to offer. Sharing the same slopes as we know in the winter, there is a series of bridges, platforms, and ziplines spanning over five acres. There are 170 elements, 142 platforms, 43 ziplines; the tallest platform is 68 feet and the longest zipline is 350 feet. There are 13 courses with varying levels of difficulty: three yellow courses (Sunflower, Sunshine, and Snapdragon), five greens (Forest Run, Mountain Trail, Grand Rapids I and Grand

Rapids II and Fern Gully), two blues (Waterfall and Rip Tide), two single black diamonds (Black Storm and Black Widow) and a double black... The Commando! All courses, except Commando, have at least one zip line and some have several. Grand Rapids is a dual zip line course that allows climbers to go from the park to the base via 2 sets of 6 side-by-side zip lines. The sixth and final zip travels down across the Tannenbaum base area to finish next to the Tannenbaum Lodge. How fun!?

Everyone is harnessed in with a special locking lanyard that safeguards you from falling if you slip or let go. Children must be at least 7 years old, and all guests must be able to perform certain physical tasks to participate (weight

limit of 250lbs). Although it is no at all strength, it is also strategy and balance! We ask that you please dress appropriately with closed toe shoes (sneakers or hiking shoes) and bring rain gear if necessary! For your safety and comfort, we ask that you tie your hair back and do not wear any dangling jewelry! Tickets are for a three-hours and most climbers complete three to four courses during that time. Bring mom this weekend for Mother's Day to climb! All moms climb for free on May 8th when someone else in the party purchases their own Sky High Pass. **Reservations are required on weekends and suggested for weekdays at the Aerial Park, call (716) 699-HIGH. Save by purchasing online at least 14 days in advance.**

"I Remember Mama." I confess, I was one of those pajama-clad kids, gathered in front of the black-and-white tv with my entire family every Friday night from 1949 through my early teens in 1957, watching this beloved show. We were captivated as Mama's daughter, Katrin would leaf through the family photo album saying, "This old album makes me remember so many things in the past. ... Her love was unconditional.

When I assess my list of friends and acquaintances, I find women who are not birthmothers yet seem to be as important to their families as if they had birthed them themselves. It's proof that maternal love doesn't have to start in the womb. It manifests itself in commitment, unconditional love, dedication, genuine interest, and fierce protection. Whether your own mom is known to you as mother, mommy, momma, ma, or in other cultures, Ummi (Arabic), Matka (Polish/Czech), Mutter (German), Mam (Dutch), Madre (Italian) or my favorite, Haha (Japanese), she invariably is the best, the greatest, the most wonderful mom in

the whole world. Mother's recognition day in some form or another is celebrated around the world, perhaps in all 195 countries! In 1914, President Woodrow Wilson signed a bill designating the second Sunday in May as a legal holiday. This Sunday, celebrate your mom by wearing a carnation (pink if she is living, or white if she is no longer among us). If she's near, visit. Take her to brunch take her a flower/gift and spend some quality time. If she is far away, for goodness' sake, call or FaceTime her early in the day so she knows the call was not an eleventh-hour afterthought. and wide green meadows frame 25-foot sculptures of fascinating stylized figures. One of these, entitled "Dancing Lady", beautifully conveys a feeling of light-hearted bliss. Near her, a line of simple metal shapes held high in the air by poles wonderfully evoke the freedom of birds in flight, reflecting her happy mood. On the opposite side, larger-than-life King and Queen sculptures stand together, getting married by a sculpture of a Bishop the same size. Those three figures together represent the general theme of Griffis Sculpture Park: "the marriage of Art and Nature". Both the Rohr Hill Road site in the park, where the sculptures above are located, and the Mill Valley Road site, which begins with a footpath through a forest containing several abstract sculptures and a small brook, demonstrate this concept. The 425-acre park was created in 1966 by

Larry Griffis, Jr., and it is the largest sculpture park in the United States. Many of the sculptures are his, and some of them depict members of his family. His basic idea was to create an open-air museum that adults and children could enjoy together. He did this by including among its artwork sculptures that children enjoy discovering and climbing on, such as giant insects. The Rohr Hill site includes metal sculptures of animals among the trees, including a life-size giraffe. The Mill Valley Road site features many sculptures that interest kids scattered throughout the hills, including a fantastical castle and submarine. (Note: There are a number of nudes. One pond is ringed by several sculptures of nude women that look as though they are about to dive in. The others include a woman in the woods in a yoga position and two standing male sculptures. "The sculptures of swimming women will soon be back in the pond", said Nila Griffis Lampman. Executive Director of the Ashford Hollow Foundation, which manages the park. The Essex Arts Center in Buffalo,

also connected with the park, promotes the arts and art education, and has introduced countless children to art appreciation and artistic skills. "Kids from school groups and summer camps have a great time when they visit the park", Nila said. Another way to enjoy the park: you can have your wedding there, or another type of event or party, or book a four-hour tour, led by Mark Griffis.

The park's much-anticipated 9th Annual Summer Festival will be held on Sunday, August 22nd, 2022, from 1 p.m. to 6 p.m. There will be music, craft vendors, food trucks, crafts for kids, and more. Buses will be available on-site during the festival.

Open from dawn to dusk, you can visit the Park from May 1st to Halloween. Don't forget to look for Night Lights to return in the fall, from mid-September through Columbus Day! 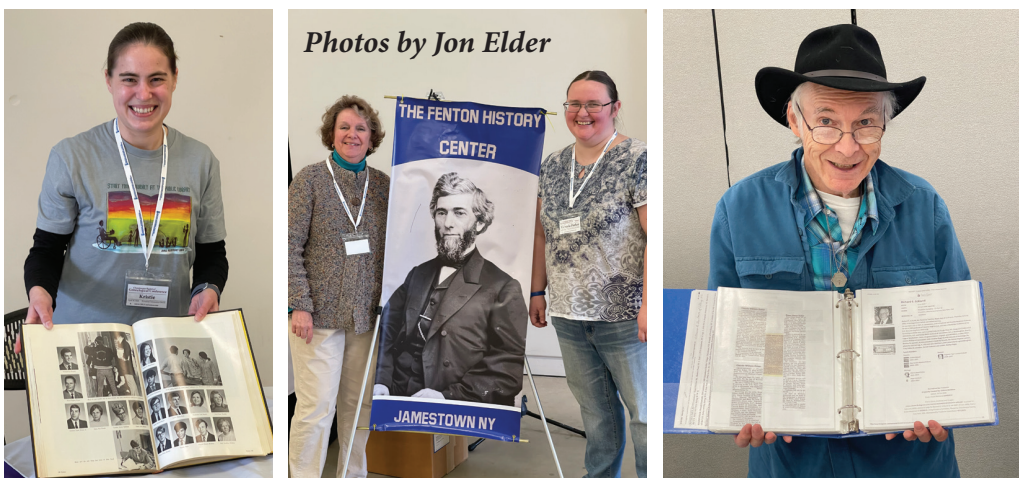

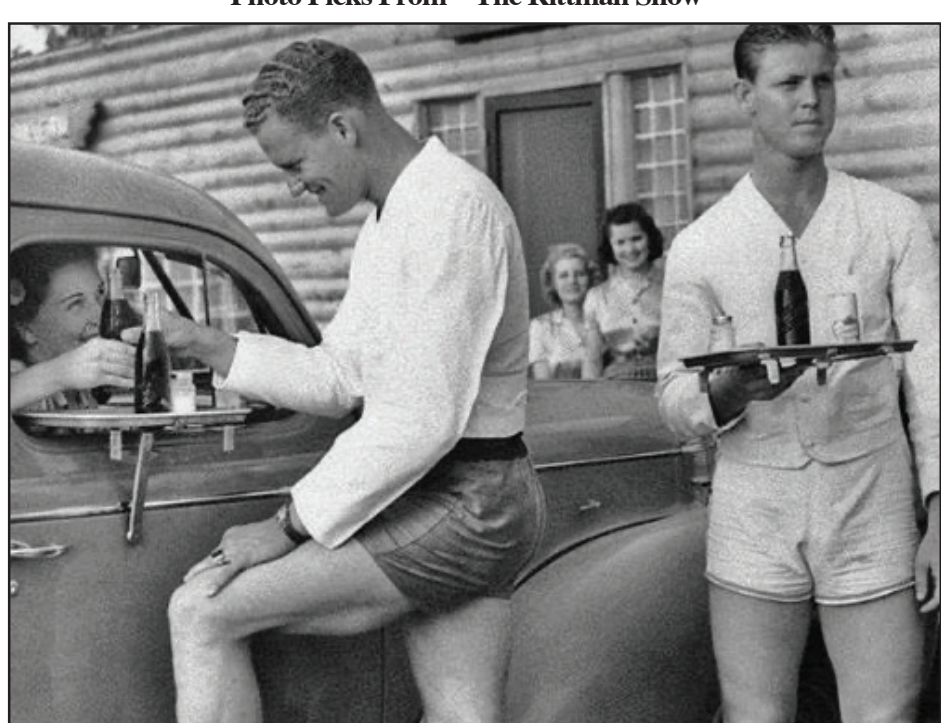
V: Anything else to add?

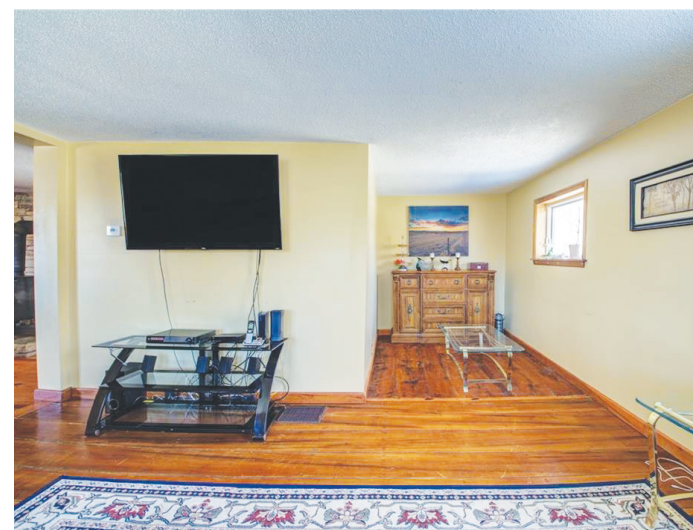

Lobelia Extract: I can't tell you enough how much this remedy has helped me and others over the years! It's my number one remedy in my herbal first aid kit. Lobelia is an anti-spasmodic that relaxes muscle cramps or spasms and can be used to ease pain, reduce feelings of anxiety and stress, ease asthma attacks, and relieve tension headaches. Lobelia can also be used as an emetic to induce vomiting in case of food poisoning or food. The extract works best for first aid purposes.

Essential oils are great additions to any first aid kit. I always have an analgesic EO blend can be applied topically to ease pain of headaches, muscle aches, arthritis, sore throats, and much more, it can also be inhaled to relieve respiratory congestion and promote mental alertness. It also makes a great remedy for insect bites and stings. This blend contains essential oils like wintergreen, menthol, camphor, and a secret blend of other essential oils, and sawflower oil. Sawflower oil contains proteins, vitamins, minerals, and essential fatty acids and has long been used in Asia for relieving inflammation. This blend can be found in a cream form, where arnica and ginger were added for an extra feature for

pain relief. **Activated Charcoal:** Every home should have some activated charcoal on hand for use in case of poisoning, especially if there are small children. It lasts forever, so there is no worry about it going bad. It is also good for intestinal gas, diarrhea, spider bites, bee stings, and absorbing poisons that have been ingested.

Enzyme Spray: This spray contains six classes of enzymes that breakdown organic chemicals that cause odor and stains. Besides this household uses, you can spray it on swollen and tender tissues to ease pain and promote healing. It is specifically helpful for sunburn, insect bites and stings, and rashes and other skin irritations. Nanoparticle silver is an antiseptic is a must for a first aid kit and nanoparticle silver made with aqua sol technology is one of the best choices. The liquid form can be sprayed on the throat for sore throats, into the sinuses for sinus congestion or dropped in the ears for ear infections. The silver gel is an excellent hand sanitizer and topical antiseptic for any type of sore or wound.

Garden Girl: Hellebores

Humble Yet Headstrong Perennial is Well Adapted

Helleborus or Hellebores are a rather humble yet headstrong perennial that are well adapted to our conditions in the northeastern United States. Although not a native to North America the Helleborus is not considered invasive. Appreciation for their good points are: they are frost resistant, showy, evergreen and they flower over a long period of time, starting in very early spring and lasting until late summer. Helleborus have wildlife value because they provide forage to those bees that emerge while most flowers are still scarce. Also named the Lenten Rose or Christmas Rose, the magnificent Helleborus flowers usually bloom during late winter or in the Lenten season in very early spring. The five petal-like sepals persist throughout the summer



on leathery dark green foliage. They will self-sow seeds around their crowns. The Helleborus come in an endless variety and in many colours ranging from creamy white, pale greens, soft pinks, dark maroons and blacks. The only requirement for upkeep is removing the previous year's manky leaves in mid spring after the new flowers have well emerged. Some of the old leaves can be left behind to protect new seedlings and or to act as a mulch for preventing new weeds. Sometimes unexpected hybrids can appear from close proximity of different varieties and colours. To

moms love so much! It is a blend of the flower essences of star of Bethlehem, rock rose, impatiens, clematis, and cherry plum. It is super helpful for easing both emotional

and physical shock. It eases feelings of anxiety and anger and helps one be present and focused in emergencies. It can also be applied topically to speed the healing of minor injuries and burns. I used this remedy several times when my children were little specially around the toddler season. Herbal Salve: There

prevent colour changes I like to deadhead darks to keep the whites white. From only a few starter plants we have divided and transplanted them to now exceed probably 100 plants to create borders around perennial gardens here at the Caretakers Cottage. There is a lot of history in legend and folklore surrounding the Helleborus full of excitement, mysteries, and dangers. I just like to consider it a magical, enchanted plant that can symbolize serenity, peace and tranquility that adds an enormous visual element to the gardens. Try one, you'll like it!



Although humorous, as were most of the speeches at this family-oriented event, whose humorous tone was set by MC Matt Wilkinson, VP of Great Lakes Cheese, their important message clearly hit home. THIS IS A BIG, HOLY COW DEAL, CATTARAUGUS COUNTY!

Giglio stressed, "This was the way it's supposed to work. Everybody did their job." And a gigantic job it was! You see, the hunt for a WNY property large and flat enough to accommodate the 500,000 square-foot new cheese manufacturing plant to replace the one in Cuba, as NYS Senator George Borrello very bluntly stated, was "quite a dumpster fire." Determined to remain in this region, they reviewed 100 options but found themselves without feasible opportunities until Jason Schwab and Kody Sprague offered the 120+ acres upon which the plant will be constructed.

The Ohio-based company has eight plants across the United States. With a capital investment of \$518M, this project is the largest infrastructure investment in the company's history and the "largest economic development project in the history of Cattaraugus County since the IDA's inception" stated CCIDA Executive Director Corey Wiktor. Kudos, CCIDA! Combined with the company's processing facility in the North Country (Clinton, Essex, Franklin, Hamilton, St. Lawrence, Jefferson and Lewis Counties) Great Lakes Cheese now uses about 14.4% of New York's total milk production. When this new plant is in operation (2025), it will double its milk consumption to 1.42 billion pounds annually. Not sure how many Olympic-sized swimming pools that will fill, but it's great news for NYS dairy farmers!

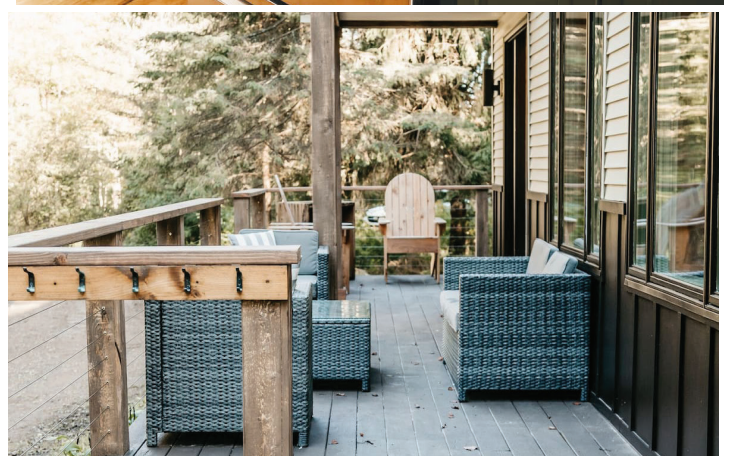
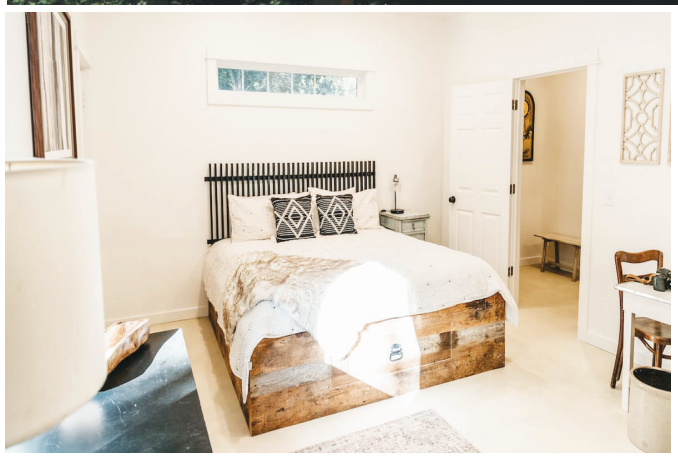

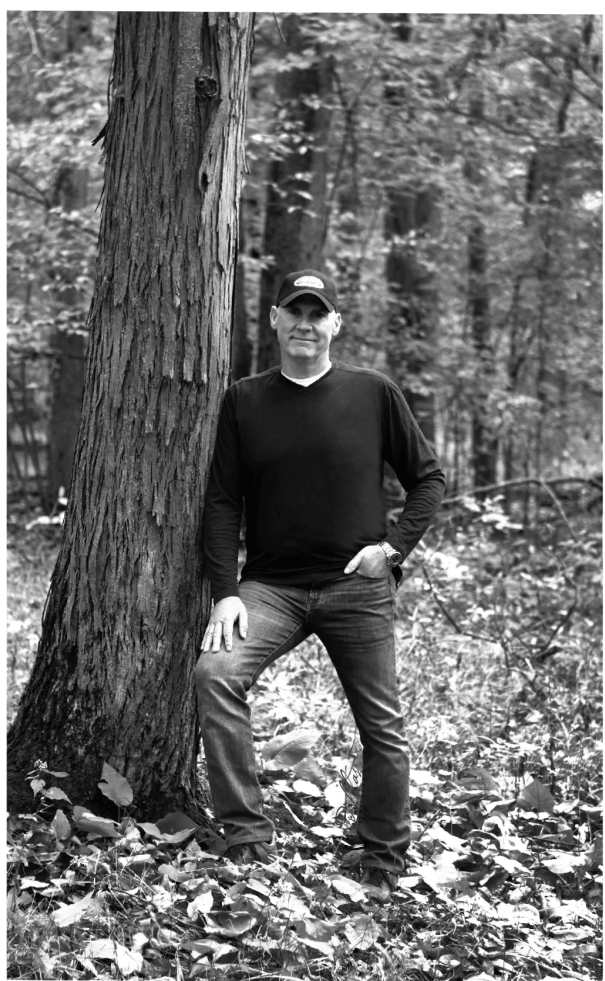
