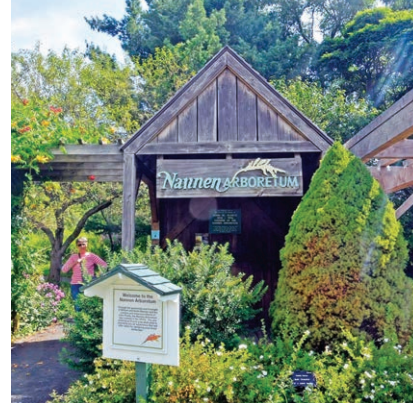

EVL Chamber Spotlight: Nannen Arboretum Cornell Cooperative Ext. Invites You to Nature

"And into the forest I go, to lose my mind and find my soul." - John Muir.

Nannen Arboretum is a sanctuary for hundreds of trees, shrubs, perennial flowers, herbs and nature walks, just a short walk away from the hustle and bustle of main street. It is a peaceful place to take a walk or attend an event such as a wedding, celebration of life, or an educational program. The arboretum serves as a quiet getaway to nature in all seasons.

A paved path welcomes visitors and guides the way on a quarter mile loop around the park kiosks providing information for a self-guided tour. Informative tree signs provide botanical and cultural information along the way. It is a place for all ages too, as it is relatively a flat and safe place to walk and appreciate the beauty of nature.

Bill and Sadie Nannen donated the land to the Cornell Cooperative Extension - Cattaraugus County in 1958. In 1974-1976. John Ploetz, a retired tree expert from Davey Tree and then an intern at the extension, proposed developing an arboretum on the grounds and developed

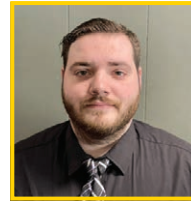

Celebrating Flag Day June 14th, 2022

Fly Your Flag Proudly... And Correctly



remove it and take it to the local Legion or VFW to be properly disposed of by burning. And, please, fly it on a pole, window, or a building where it can receive the respect it deserves by flying unobstructed. Throughout history, people have risked their lives to fly the flag. During the Civil War, being a color (flag) bearer was an incredibly prestigious, important, and dangerous assignment. Flags were often made by women from the areas where units were initially raised so the women of their hometowns sent them off to war with a flag they made for their soldiers. Needless to say, the flag took on additional meaning, connecting them to their home, their loved ones and their way of life – giving them even more of a reason to fight. A color bearer carried no weapons – only the flag. They were on the front line, so the men attached to their unit knew where they were on the battlefield. When they couldn't hear commands

On June 14, 1777, the United States of America approved the design for its first national flag. In 1916, President Woodrow Wilson proclaimed June 14 as the official date for Flag Day and 33 years later, in 1949, Congress permanently established the date at National Flag Day. Times haven't changed in Congress, have they? Each year, the sitting president proclaims the week of June 14 as National Flag Week. All Americans are encouraged to fly their U.S. flags during the week. If the weather is bad, it should

touch the ground. If it is not illuminated, it should come down by sunset and go back up after sunrise the following day. In a time of national mourning, it should be flown at half-mast. Check for further protocols at protocolhelp@state.gov. Never, ever fly a tattered flag. Never. Johnny Cash practically immortalized the beloved song, "Ragged Old Flag," but, unless your tattered flag has accompanied Washington across the Delaware, or survived the battles at Fort McHenry or New Orleans, The Alamo, Chancellorsville, or Shiloh ... Please don't fly it. If it's still hanging there in shreds,

because of the noise, they could always see their colors to orient themselves. A color-bearer had to be trusted to stay in front facing the enemy. Should a color-bearer fall in battle, another would immediately take his place. Troops protected the flag at all costs, even giving their lives, knowing how humiliating,

and disastrous it would be if their colors got into the hands of the enemy. Who hasn't stood in awe and respect at the sight of the depiction of the six Marines struggling to hoist the heavy flagpole on top of Mount Suribachi at Iwo Jima on February 23, 1945? And remember the hope we felt after the shock and devastation of 9/11, when the raising of an American flag by first responders gave us hope, a promise of rebirth, and an acknowledgment of those

who lost their lives and those who never hesitated to try to save them. Those two flags told stories that make your heart swell with pride. Just as they fill you with pride so too should the flag you fly at your home or place of business. Keep it clean, crisp, protected from high winds and the elements. It's worth the effort to take it down when bad weather threatens. Salute it. Fold it properly. Treat it with respect that it, and our country deserves.

The Villager (V): Can you start out by giving us a little background, who you are, your involvement with Stroll the Streets...

Jessica Gilbert (JG): I am Jessica Gilbert. I own Ava Grace Fashions here in Ellicottville, NY. My family and I have lived here for just about 15 years. I have been on the Stroll the Streets committee since it started. As other volunteers have gotten busy and moved on to other endeavors, I have stuck with our event to organize and keep it going. (V): When does it take place?

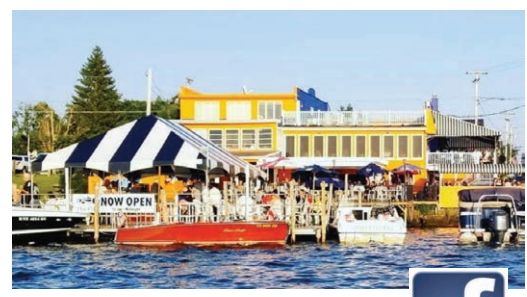
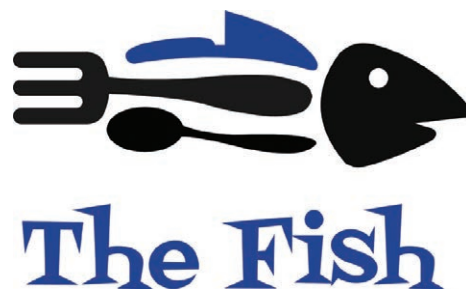

(JG): The Rotary of Ellicottville has been

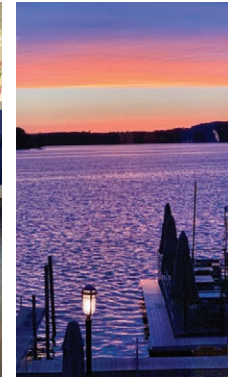

drawings/graphics, glass/acrylic, mixed media and creative crafts (both hard and soft). This year's poster features several building facades -- and a stream of bubbles, nicely capturing the bubbly mood of all the art-lovers who were disappointed by the show's cancellation due to Covid the last two years. The imagination and talent behind all the categories are fantastic:

The photos you'll find in the photographers' booths wonderfully capture subjects ranging from local scenic beauty and charming European street scenes to a baby fox and a movie marquee. The numerous paintings that will be on display include: a simple but classic painting of three apples (red yellow and green); another featuring an expertly painted blooming amaryllis; and others nicely depicting cute little children, bunnies and flamingoes.

To mention just a few of the many works of art to be seen: the glass category includes glass adorned with red and yellow tulips and a whimsical, colorful frog wearing a vest. In the creative crafts category, the hard items include artfully carved decorative items including: a chair, a table, a bench, and a wall decoration that reads "Family Makes This House a Home". The soft items in that category include leather bags and a leather vest. The drawings/graphics category includes drawings of a mermaid with a golden tail, admiring herself in a mirror; and roses in a container. The mixed media category includes an image of cuddling owls, while the sculpture category includes art depicting hummingbirds, and a butterfly. The clay

the National Comedy Center in Jamestown, a peripatetic life has raised the profile of what was named Best New Museum in the Country by USA Today and one of its World's Greatest Places by Time Magazine.

Marketing awards keep coming for the Comedy Center. It just received the New York State Excellence Award for their 2021 public relations campaign, which included coverage of acquisition of Carl Reiner archives on the Today Show in March; CBS Saturday Morning spotlight on the Comedy Center with its 70th anniversary celebration of I Love Lucy in October; and a feature segment on Lucy and Desi on CBS Sunday Morning--highest rated network morning show in the country--in December.

"Each of these stories shined a national spotlight on the National Comedy Center, Jamestown and Chautauqua County as wonderful destinations to visit," Hahn says.

And they recently won four Telly Awards, which honor excellence in video and television across all screens, winning in every category they submitted. Hahn's love of classic television began at five or six years of age. "I Love Lucy, The Dick Van Dyke Show, The Mary Tyler Moore Show and The Carol Burnett Show were all a vital part of my 'education'."

He made his first pilgrimage to Jamestown and the Lucy Desi Museum with his family 15 years ago "because I wanted to see Lucy's hometown--well before I knew that I would be living and working here."

"I'm also a very big comedy fan--from stand-up to sketch and improv to classic

television, so I could not resist the opportunity to help build the National Comedy Center's brand and bring visitors from around the country to Jamestown."

Prior to joining the Comedy Center in 2018, Hahn served as vice president, chief marketing officer for Elvis Presley Enterprises in Memphis, TN. There he oversaw re-branding for the \$137 million expansion of Graceland in 2016-2017 and marketing and production of major events.

With Graceland the number one tourism destination in Memphis and one of the top three attractions in Tennessee, "I learned a tremendous amount on how drive attendance for a national-scale attraction and how to build an audience with cost-effective marketing and public relations initiatives."

His first jobs were at major advertising agencies in Los Angeles and New York, followed by five years at Warner Bros. Television and nine years at XM Satellite Radio in Washington, D.C. Just over a year after coming to the Comedy Center, Hahn faced a whole new challenge.

He was instrumental in navigating the National Comedy Center through the COVID era, finding new and innovative ways to stay connected to comedy fans across the county as the team transformed one of the most interactive museums in the world into a safe, touch-free and worry-free visitor experience through its award-winning LaughSafe health and safety program.

Hahn says it was modeled after programs developed by Hilton Hotels and United Airlines, which partnered with medical institutions.

"We were very pleased to partner with UMPC, including health and safety protocol reviews with

UMPC epidemiologists and an on-site inspection with local UPMC Chautauqua professionals."

Post-visit research confirms "99% of National Comedy Center guests feel comfortable and safe during their visit, and report that their museum experience had been worry-free, stress-free and touch-free," he says.

During the early days of the pandemic, Hahn was also a key member of the team that launched the Comedy Center's new online platform National Comedy Center Anywhere (anywhere.comedycenter.org), and reimagined its annual Lucille Ball Comedy Festival as a virtual experience featuring comedy conversations with over 30 major artists.

Anticipating a big summer, staff are preparing two new multimedia exhibits. One, marking the centennial of Carl Reiner, opens in late July. Another, opening in late June, marks the 60th

This writer had the opportunity to sit down with Anne Northrup (and husband, John). Allow me to introduce you to the multi-layered Anne Widger Northrup, daughter of Kate and Dr. David Widger and granddaughter of Jack and Elsie Widger of Ellicottville.

Anne straddled two communities growing up in Salamanca and spending time in Ellicottville. Her dad taught her to sail at age 7. She loved it and credits him for her adventurous spirit. Well into her teen years sailing gave them both opportunities to have precious one-on-one time; as a young woman, this skill equipped her and two friends for an ocean trek from Bermuda to Block Island. Turning her skill into college income, Anne taught windsurfing at Chautauqua Lake. Her mom, Kate, taught her to golf which provided her with one-on-one mom time, and a skill to now enjoy with friends and family. It is her mom she credits for her competitive genes.

Anne grew particularly animated when talking about her love for the sport of tennis. Again, she learned from her parents (see a pattern here, parents?) who played with Edna and Doc Northrup here in Ellicottville by the Town Hall (raise your hand if you remember the courts).

Drive past the Northrup homestead at the corner of Elizabeth Street and Route 242, and you might see several horses in the pasture. Again, family involvement played a role in forming this multi-talented young woman's passions. Lillian Congdon, a family friend, encouraged 12-year-old Anne to learn to ride her horses so that she and Lillian could ride together. Thirty-two years ago, Anne acquired her own horses and now enjoys Natural Horsemanship and training.

Anne's parents taught her to ski. She raced, became certified to teach both downhill and Telemark skiing, and taught at Holiday Valley. Anne and John love hiking, leading them to climb several

14,000' peaks. Hiking also took her to Peru and a 55-mile trail around Machu Picchu. These mountain treks kept her feet on the ground, but put her head into the clouds, which was the place she most wanted to be since high school.

One day, thirty years ago, John asked Anne what she would most like to do. Without hesitating, she said "fly". Within two weeks of that conversation, Anne had put in 10 hours of flight training and on June 2, 1992, she was ready to solo. When she was awarded her license, her instructor informed her that he was awarding her a license to cautiously "learn" for the rest of her life. Two years later, John got his wings and their life of adventures in the sky commenced.

Their explorations have taken them all over America, into Alaska, over mountains and oceans, filling their photo albums with sights many of us only dream of. Anne relates that one of the most exciting things that happened for her was when, in 1994, she was flying into LaGuardia and was instructed to take her place in the queue to land following The Concorde. One year, she and John flew commercial into Australia meeting up with some friends and renting planes. They flew all over the Outback for several weeks, watching herds of kangaroos and camels (yes, camels) from the air. They spent time in Coober Pedy, the old opal mining town where residents

live underground (escaping 120-degree summers). In the 2500 hours Anne has logged, it would take a book to record all her/their adventures.

But all is not play. Suffice it to say that Anne and John have, characteristically, used their talents and resources to treat residents, friends, and kids to otherwise undreamed-of opportunities to put their heads into the clouds and perhaps be inspired to consider flying themselves. Along with their diverse business ventures, they generously share their abundance with the community in many quiet ways. To name only a few: the Northrups maintain Sunset Hill Cemetery and St. John's Episcopal Church, and volunteer in assisting the Family Support for Ellicottville group. They and a partner bought the old Eddy's Restaurant and leased it so that Katy's Fly-In is available for visiting fliers when they land. The best news of all is that Ellicottville is blessed to have countless community members who positively impact our community in matters great and small. You see, every gesture, every good work, every helping hand, every smile, contributes to the whole that is our community.

community support to make it happen. In 2013, the Cooperative Extension sold the property to the Town of Ellicottville and the Nannen Arboretum Society Inc. was created to maintain the arboretum grounds and provide fundraising efforts to secure its future.

Nan Miller and Pat Kerl are both retired Master Gardeners with the Cornell Cooperative Extension-Cattaraugus County and founding members of Nannen Arboretum Society, Inc. The society was incorporated in 2013 to maintain the arboretum grounds and provide fundraising efforts to secure its future. They both enjoy their active roles with the Arboretum, Nan is President and Pat is Treasurer.

"One of the most unique things about our arboretum," says Pat "is the variety of oak trees. The oak tree is a very important tree to environmental diversity and ecology. The arboretum contains 40 oak trees of 10 different species. John Ploetz loved unique trees and brought some trees from his own property to the arboretum. As an example, John discovered the Cary Maple at the home of Mary Flagler Cary, now the Cary Arboretum. John took a cutting from the tree and had it propagated at the Brooklyn Botanical Gardens and eventually planted at the Nannen Arboretum. John had the tree patented for Mrs. Cary in 1965."

In addition to appreciating a variety of trees, visitors

can enjoy several features throughout the arboretum including the Carolyn Lowe Herb Garden, Northrup Nature Hall, Chapman Sanctuary, Japanese Garden including the pond and the stone garden, Pollinator Garden, Shrub Garden, and Al Cox Perennial Garden.

The Nannen Arboretum is a place to enjoy nature through all the seasons. In the spring, one can find flowering crabapples and other trees in bloom. Summer gives a rainbow of colors from the perennial and annual plants amongst many different shapes of tree leaves and bark. As summer folds into fall, the leaves changing from green to vibrant colors of yellow, red and orange. The Red Sugar Maple is a sight to be seen, as well as the foliage on the distant slopes in the background. As snow begins to fall in winter, visitors can appreciate the cold solitude along the lake, as well as snowshoeing or cross-country skiing through the arboretum.

Visitors will notice the grounds are incredibly well maintained. Nan and Pat are proud of the persistence of everyone in the Nannen Arboretum Society including members, volunteers, and board members. The Society is a not-for-profit and categorized as a charitable organization. They are responsible for the maintenance and enhancement of the arboretum grounds. Volunteers meet every Monday morning to maintain and enhance the trees and perennial gardens. "Ellicottville is very civic minded and always ready to pitch in. We are grateful to have the support of this community and visitors

alike."

Nan and Pat's favorite thing about working at the arboretum is the sense of community working with the other volunteers and interacting with the visitors strolling through the arboretum. "One of the best times is early morning when the fog is lifting from the pond and the ski slopes become visible in the distance. We also love watching the trees and the rest of the arboretum change with the seasons."

Tours are available upon request, and last about 1 hour. They also host guest speakers and workshops throughout the year, generally on a quarterly basis. Watch for upcoming Tree & Shrub Workshops on June 4, and October 15, 2022.

The arboretum is a volunteer supported organization funded by donations. Readers can make a monetary donation of any amount in a secure donation box at the entrance to the arboretum, online or by mail. Memorial bricks for the "Celebration Walkway" are available for sale in 2 sizes. If interested, readers may choose to gift a tree or shrub from a pre-selected list, some native to the Western New York area. Benches are also available memorialized with a personal message and/or special name on a poly plaque.

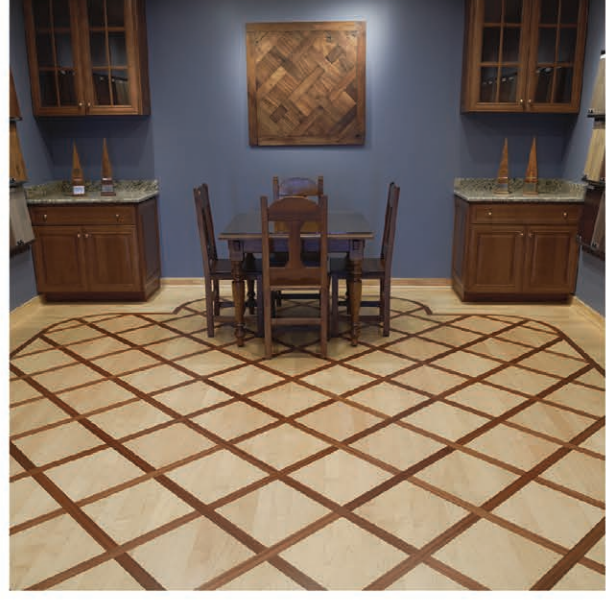
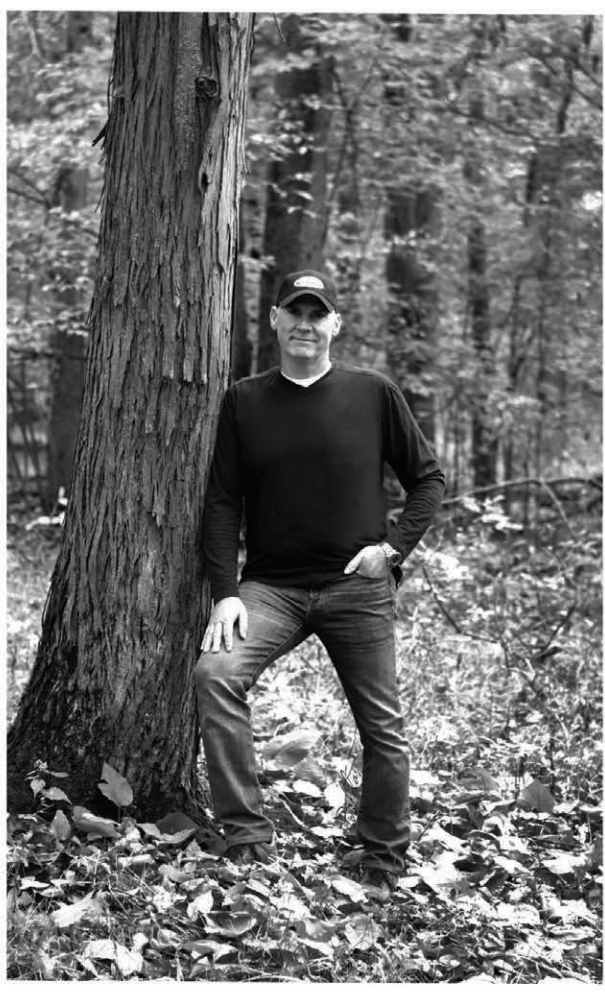
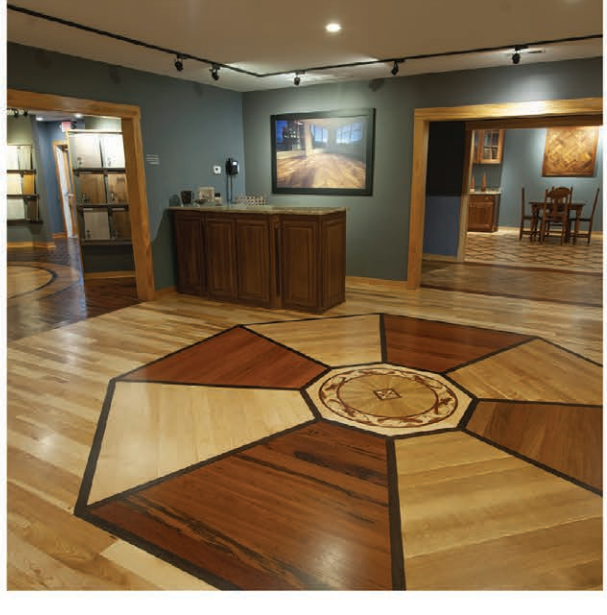
