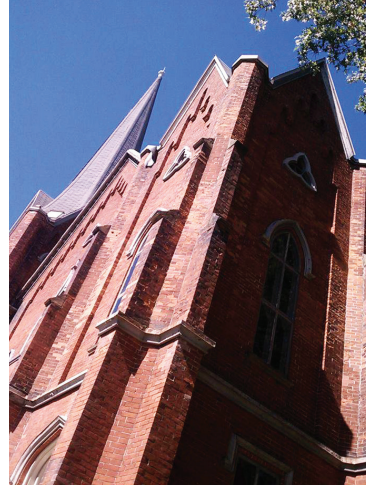

(October 10th, 2022) Have you ever wondered where your meat comes from? Are you looking to reduce the steps between the farm and your freezer, but aren't sure how? Do you want the opportunity to meet local livestock farmers who sell the meat they raise? Would you like to participate in a FREE tasting of dishes prepared to feature locally produced meats? If you answered yes to any of these questions, then this event is for you! The public is invited to join us for two "Meet Your Farmer" events this November. The first will be held on Saturday, November 5th from 1:00pm - 3:00pm at Cornell Cooperative Extension of Cattaraugus County (28 Parkside Drive) in Ellicottville, NY. The second will be held on

Wednesday, November 9th from 6:00pm - 8:00pm at the Fluvanna Volunteer Fire Department (3536 Fluvanna Ave) in Jamestown, NY. All are welcome to come to one or both events to taste locally produced beef, pork, lamb, goat, and chicken, and visit with area farmers to learn more about their farm businesses, ask questions, and learn more about purchasing meat directly from a farmer. Farmers will have booths at the event with individual cuts and bulk meat available for purchase. In addition to the pop-up farmer's market and meat tasting, will have an official program where farmers and extension specialists will share information about bulk ordering meat, how to fill out meat cut sheets, how to utilize the website Meat Suite to find local farms, and trends in the meat industry. A panel of farmers will be available as part of this discussion, so bring your questions! This year, we are hosting a raffle for a series of gift certificates donated

by the events' participating farms. Every attendee will receive one ticket, with additional tickets available for purchase. You will need to be present to win, and the drawing will be held following the short educational session on bulk meat purchasing described above. This event is co-hosted by Cornell Cooperative Extension of Chautauqua County and the Cornell Cooperative Extension SWNY Dairy, Livestock, and Field Crops Program. HoliMont Resort Update

Summer Work for Winter Fun

At first glance, it all looks easy: Early in the season the slopes are blanketed with snow, the lifts are humming, and happy skiers and riders are making turns descending the mountain. Behind this resort bliss, however, is the unseen extensive off-season planning and intensive work of installing new infrastructure. The ski and ride areas are a twelve-month operation where the work and the satisfaction of building for the future never ends.

A winter resort's lifeblood is new skiers and riders. Happy new skiers and riders often translate into lifelong skiers and riders. HoliMont made major upgrades the past two seasons to accommodate beginners. Last year, one of the longest conveyor lifts in North America was installed at the bottom of the Meadow slope. This year, to complement this lift, HoliMont moved a smaller conveyor lift previously in use at the bottom of the Sunset slope to this new beginner area. The idea is that we now have a winning trifecta in place for novice skiers and riders: At first, our instructors can now start skiers and riders in this beginner area in a "sliding zone" where they first learn to do the most basic maneuvers to familiarize themselves with the sensations of skiing and riding. Secondly, our novice guests can quickly progress to the shorter "Rabbits Run" conveyor lift which has a very gentle pitch. Finally, after learning how to turn and stop in control on this gentler pitch, they can progress to the much longer and slightly more inclined slope serviced by the "Grasshopper" conveyor lift. Novice heaven? We think so. Other major infrastructure improvements this summer were evident in the churned-up soil visible on the slopes in the vicinity of our flagship high speed Exhibition chairlift. As

aspiring competitors will be exposed to both Ski Racing and Freestyle skiing. At eight years old, they can choose a pipeline of either Freestyle or Racing. HoliMont will also be introducing a new "HoliFreeSki Team." These skiers will be practicing and competing in the terrain parks and halfpipe. In the world of traditional Snowsports instruction, HoliMont will be introducing a full day, five-hour private lesson for anyone over 18. We have many highly qualified instructors who can enhance your skiing or riding experience. This summer, one other under-the-radar but very important infrastructure improvement was made at HoliMont. At the HoliMont garage where vehicles are serviced, a new hydraulic lift was installed that can lift 40,000 pounds. Is 40,000 pounds roughly the combined weight of the Buffalo Bills hoisting the Vince Lombardi trophy? 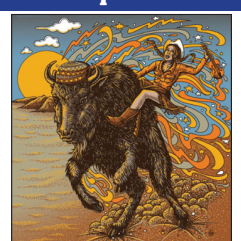

Restore New York

Village of Ellicottville Believes in Initiative for Future Growth



“The Restore New York Communities Initiative (“Restore NY”) provides municipalities with financial assistance for the revitalization of commercial and residential properties. The program encourages community development and neighborhood growth through the redevelopment of blighted structures.”

If Ellicottville is awarded the grants, the new worker housing would involve three buildings: the 1887 building (pictured) and additional over by the newly planned parking lot between Rockwell Avenue and Martha Street, with apartments in each one.

The village of Ellicottville now has high hopes of bringing exciting new developments to the area. Its expectations center around recent efforts to secure grants that would revitalize certain places. One of the grants for which it has applied is offered by a program called “Restore New York”, and it is primarily for restoring buildings owned by communities that need to be restored. The other is offered by “New York Forward”, part of the Downtown Revitalization Initiative (DRI), started under Governor Cuomo. The announcement regarding whether or not the grants will be awarded to Ellicottville is not expected to be made until December, but there is a possibility this could happen sooner.

To give the grant applications every possible chance of succeeding, the Mayor of Ellicottville, John Burrell; a Village Trustee, Caitlin Croft; and Peter Krog, the owner of the 1887 Building in Ellicottville and

properties on which worker housing would be built if grant money is made available, recently made a presentation to members of the Regional Economic Council, featuring video, slides and narration. The informative presentation was backed by the extensive efforts of a well-respected consulting firm, Barton & Loguidice, which specializes in engineering, planning, environmental matters, etc., with which the Village Board of Trustees met.

“When they met with us, they steered us through the process”, said Mayor Burrell. “We had Zoom meetings, they wrote the application, they used aerial drone photography, and they did much more. We feel that we have very strong applications and that we were helped tremendously by our consultants. We’re very optimistic.” The other members of the Village Board of Trustees are the Deputy Mayor, Doug Bush, Village Trustee, Sean Lowes, and the newest Village Trustee, Jolie Newpher.

RESTORING 1887 BUILDING FOR RESIDENT HOUSING

The first of the three plans to use the possible grant money involves restoring the historic 1887 building in Ellicottville, which derives its name from the fact that it was built in 1887. In 1887 it was a school, and continued to be one for many years, until all the classes conducted in it were moved to the current campus south of the village. After that, it became the setting for a number of professional offices, but at this point in time it has been empty for the last ten years. “It needs to have people and life in it again”, said Mayor Burrell.

Developers have tried to create condominiums and various types of apartments there, but there were various obstacles hindering such plans, including the necessity to first have asbestos hazards removed. What grant monies would accomplish in regard to this building is that they would fund the creation of housing for residents to live full-time in Ellicottville, as opposed to part-time. At this time, it is much more common for residents of the village to only be residents there

PROGRESS ON SKATE PARK & 1887 BUILDING

Mayor John Burrell provided updates on many of the Village activities. Construction of the Skate Park is progressing with concrete being poured and the mayor attended a meeting about the park on September 26. The NY Forward and Restore NY grants both had meetings in the last month. The presentation of the NY Forward application took place on October 6th in Buffalo with Mayor

Burrell and Caitlyn Croft representing the Ellicottville application. The NY Forward grant, if approved, will be focused on funding the renovation work for the 1887 building (see story, left).

WINGATE HOTEL SEEKS TO EXPAND # OF SUITES

Mayor Burrell also attended a meeting with the Industrial Development Agency (IDA) regarding an application for the Wingate Hotel to expand the number of suites available at their property. The application will be reviewed at the upcoming IDA Board meeting on October 27.

A public hearing was set for November 15 for the resolution to implement a local law to enforce a uniform building, fire, and energy code.

OTHER NEWS

In the Village department updates, the Engineering Department is progressing with many projects. The Engineer, Planner, Code

Enforcer Office and Assessor are finishing up moving into the Town Center. The Elk Creek cleanup effort is still ongoing.

Special Events updates were provided by Doug Bush. Fall Fest was a success with minimal issues. Parking was the most reported problem during the event.

Before adjourning into the executive session, the Board approved a motion for Mayor Burrell to sign renewals for wastewater treatment agreements with Kissing Bridge and Crane Ridge. This continues the ongoing wastewater treatment services Ellicottville provides through inter-municipal agreements (IMA) with these communities.

The Town of Ellicottville held its monthly Board meeting on Wednesday, October 19. Supervisor Matthew McAndrew opened the meeting and the first topic was a public hearing for the renewal of the Spectrum Franchise Agreement for cable television. No public comments were received and the renewal was approved at the end of the meeting.

A public hearing date on the 2023 preliminary budget was set for November 9th at 4 pm at the Town Hall. Copies of the 2023 preliminary

budget are available in the Town Clerk’s office.

The Board approves a motion for the reimbursement of the CDL training costs of a Town employee over the course of six months. The reimbursement also stipulates the employee must remain an active employee over the repayment period.

Officer In Charge (OIC) Don Auge provided an update on policing of Fall Fest. OIC Auge noted that the crowds were the biggest ever, but the recorded 80 calls were in line with past years. Parking complaints were the most common issue.

Greg Keyser from the Planning Department reviewed the status of 2 solar farm applications. Also, Mr. Keyser reported on an application for a vertical farming operation that intended to utilize LED lights for a micro-farm.

The Building Department report was provided by Kelly Fredrickson. 7 new building permits were issued in September and there are 23 new homes being built in the Town and 7 in the Village.

From the Engineering Report presented by Ben Slotman, the Town Center renovation continues with

the years. “At various times I have called myself a musician, photographer, documentary producer, or garlic grower. I am originally from the area but never imagined there would be this thing called an arts center nor that someone could have a job running it.”

SCA began in 1998 as a collaboration between the Springville Players, a longtime community theater group, and various informal visual arts groups. “What started in a rented Main Street storefront has since grown to encompass four spaces in downtown Springville. Our main facility is an 1869 former church listed on the National Register where we produce theater, concerts by national touring artists, exhibits and workshops. We have additional facilities for the theater production, programs for preschoolers, and workshops. In 2020 we completed our sister project, Art’s Café, where we also program performances and workshops. Our main facility, the church building, is presently undergoing long-planned renovations to the theater space. This is a major undertaking that will fully upgrade the experience of attending. We hope to have most of the work completed next year. Until then, all of our events are presently held at Art’s Café.”

SCA has gained attention across the region attracting visitors from the surrounding areas including Buffalo, Ellicottville, Olean, Cattaraugus and even into Pennsylvania to their arts programs. “Over the past year we have done programs such as The



In 2020 they completed their sister project, Art’s Café at 5 East Main Street, where they also program performances and workshops.

Annual Art Crawl, where art is placed in downtown businesses for a one-night free event. We began a new partnership by launching a massive production of The Addams Family at the newly restored Hollywood Theater in Gowanda. Artsapalooza toured workshops and a giant puppet theater program to 12 rural communities across four counties. Most recently, we hosted a packed concert by the Grammy-nominated fiddler Jeremy Kittel.”

Upcoming events include Humbird, a concert by a singer-songwriter trio on November 5, a theater production called Jerry Finnegan’s Sister beginning November 12, and workshops in stained glass, bookbinding and basket weaving. As part of an Artist Employment Program, they now have two staff artists who will be creating “The Lab,” turning a vacant Main Street space into a mini-gallery and workshop.

SCA has enriched the community and help spread arts around the region. They have contributed to several community events, and have gotten the area youth involved in arts programs starting as young as 2 with a variety of classes for all ages. In the past few years, they have begun to focus more on public art as they are continuing to develop new pieces each year with a walking map on their website.

Seth hopes that more small towns will follow in suit and adopt an arts program. “What we do should be commonplace but unfortunately vibrant small-town arts centers are a rarity. Sometimes you hear this concept that the arts are something extra. That is just absolutely false. The arts are so central to humanity. 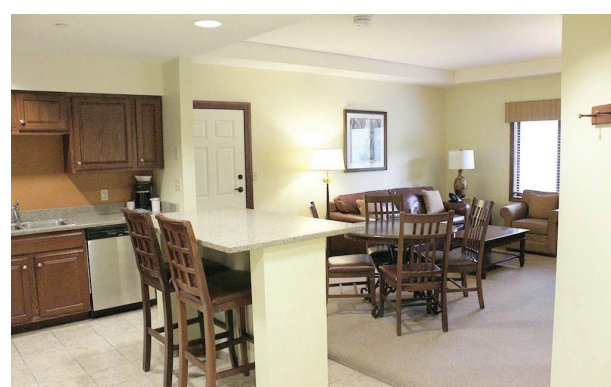

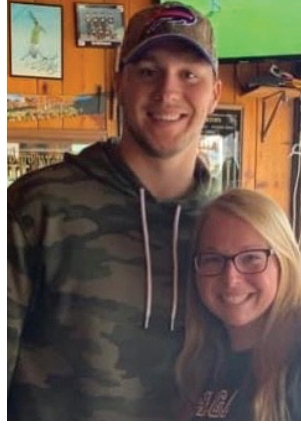

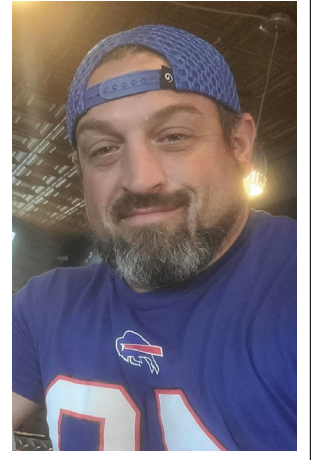

part of the time. In fact, the owners of many homes in Ellicottville mostly live in places as diverse as Toronto, Cleveland, Buffalo and elsewhere. In 1950, the local census record stated that there were 1200 full-time residents in Ellicottville, while in the present day, there are only 256 full-time residents! "This makes it difficult to have enough people on the local community boards to handle services involving ambulances,

the fire department and churches", said Mayor Burrell. "If we're awarded the grants, the new worker housing would involve three buildings (additional over by the newly planned parking lot between Rockwell Avenue and Martha Street) with apartments in each one." **STREET IMPROVEMENTS** In regard to the second of the possible plans, Mayor Burrell commented. "We included in the applications for grant money ideas regarding the improvement of lighting on Washington Street, Monroe Street, etc. We need to redo the street lights in the downtown area. Smart lighting,

WiFi, cameras and music would all be a part of the picture. At this time, music is played in downtown Ellicottville from speakers mounted on storefronts, and in the future, it could emanate from smart poles". **120-Car Public Parking** The third possibility spelled out in the improvements outlined in the applications is the creation of a 120-car public parking lot in Ellicottville. The area involved would be in the vicinity of Martha Street, Mill Street and Rockwell Avenue. "If you've ever tried parking in Ellicottville, you know how helpful this would be," said Mayor Burrell.

several remaining tasks to complete. The contractor is working to repour a concrete slab that needed to be replaced and will be installing a canopy at the end of the month. A motion was approved to extend the contract until the November meeting. Paving of the Sundance Road extension by a contractor has occurred but they were notified that the transitions between existing and new sections would need to be corrected. Also, the sidewalk on Maples Road in front of the American Legion was inspected and will need to be corrected. JD Northrup is preparing a quote for the replacement of the sidewalk from Pine Tree to the south entrance of the Legion. Mr. Slotman is also working on an inventory of the pipes providing the water service to identify

the types of pipes – lead, copper, or galvanized. The inventory is required to be done by October 2024 and Mr. Slotman is developing a proposal and cost estimate to complete the inventory. Scott Brumagin from the Highway department presented a bid for a new Hyundai Wheel Loader that will cost \$70,410 which was approved by the Board. The Board also approved the resignation of a Highway Department Employee. A local law on code enforcement had a public hearing set for November 16th at 6 pm at the Town Hall. Local Law Number 2 of 2022 is entitled "Law for Enforcement of Fire Prevention Code, Building Code and Energy Conservation Code in the Town of Ellicottville." The purpose of the proposed local law is to protect the health, safety and well-being of persons and property and to incorporate the requirements in amended Part 1203 of Title 19 of the New York Codes, Rules

and Regulations, which concern the minimum standards for administration and enforcement of the Uniform Code in municipalities within the State of New York. A copy of the proposed local law is available for inspection at the office of the Town Clerk. A request for a speed reduction on Sugartown Road was approved by the Board for referral to the County. Finally, the window and door updates under the SAM Grant for the Town Hall continued with Springville Window and Door taking measurements to provide a quote. Also, the replacement of the sign was discussed and the NYS Historic Preservation Office will be contacted to review any restrictions that may apply to the sign displayed on a historic building. 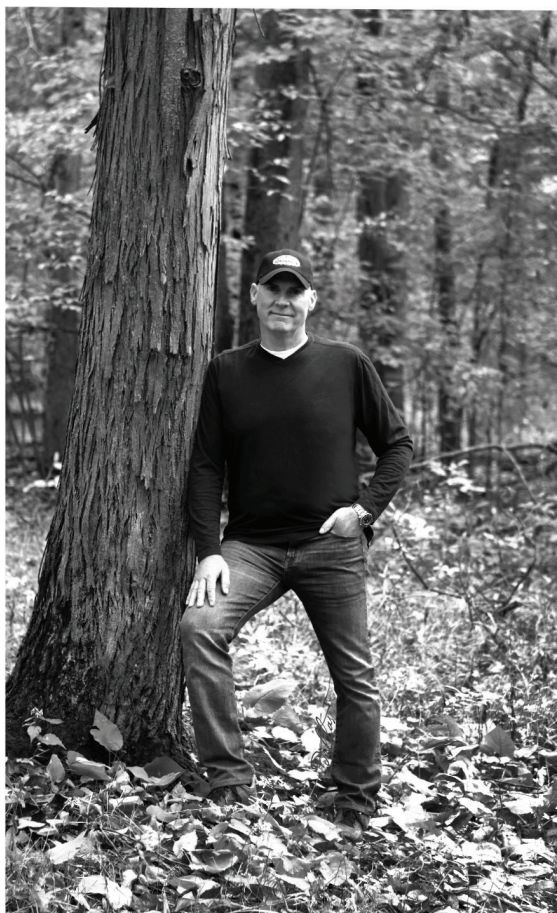
