Another larger-than-life character is the loveable cartoon Great Dane, Marmaduke. His creator, Brad Anderson, was from Portland, (near Jamestown). In honor of Brad and Marmaduke, Portland has erected a life-sized statue honoring them on Route 20 (87 West Main Street).

A ten-foot giant head (sculpture), Ong-Gwe-Ohn-Weh, created by Peter Wolf Toth, resides in in a small park along the shores of Lake Erie in Dunkirk. Toth created it from the trunk of a dead elm tree in two months in 1973, for free. Time took its toll on it, so Toth returned to Dunkirk in 2014 and restored the head, adding six tears. An immigrant from the 1956 uprising when the Soviets overtook Hungary, Toth and his family lived in refugee camps, eventually immigrating to Akron, Ohio. His keen interest in the native North American culture sprung from his own

## Fall Fest Letter to the Editor

### Fall Festival Rules and Regulations for 2022

Letter to the editor: As Ellicottville readies itself to host its largest Festival of the year, we would like to let you know what we have been working on. The Special Events committee, Ellicottville Police Dept, Catt Co. Sheriff's Dept, NY State Police, EVL Fire Dept., Village and Town Boards, Code enforcement, DPW, Chamber of Commerce, NYS DOT, along with input from local residents, merchants and bar owners have been working diligently since Nov. of 2012 on ways to improve Fall Festival as we know it.

**ZERO TOLERANCE** is the LAW and will be strictly enforced. This means absolutely no alcohol is allowed on village streets. You will not be allowed to leave an establishment or private property, walk to, from or within the village with open containers. Drink it or leave it. Public intoxication and disorderly conduct will not be tolerated.

**NOISE LEVELS** have been addressed with the local bars and beer tents. Outdoor live music will end at 11PM. quieter, background music until midnight. in accordance with the local sound level ordinance. Private homes are also be obligated to obey this law.

**PARKING:** We strongly encourage carpooling, use

of shuttles or walk! Space is limited and illegally parked vehicles (including motorcycles) will be ticketed and towed. Fire lanes, hydrants, and sidewalks are not to be blocked. Observe all temporary and regular no parking signs. Remember that flagmen for private lots are not allowed in the streets. Note that illegally parked vehicles on private property are the land owner's responsibility.

**BUSES:** Hired bus drop and pick up site will be located at the DPW building on Mill & Martha Street. Parking for buses is on RTE 219, beyond Holiday Valley Rd at the old driving range site. Buses will NOT be allowed to load or unload elsewhere. Bus lines will be notified of open container law, and are expected to adhere.

**SHUTTLE SERVICE:** Daytime loading site at Jefferson St & Martha St. Sat & Sun 10 am – 7 pm Evening site is at the New M&T Bank parking lot 7pm to 3 am, 7pm to midnight on Sunday

The shuttle destinations are to most of the condos between the Village and Holiday Valley all other destinations will require the taxi service, Uber etc. Taxi Call: 375-TAXI, (Lyft & Uber), call in advance as they can be very busy. **POLICE WILL NOT GIVE YOU A RIDE!**

**REST ROOMS:** There will be plenty of port-o-johns provided throughout the festival area, they are cleaned routinely, use them! Public urination is against the law and violators will be prosecuted.

**EMERGENCY AND FIRST AID LOCATION:** Sheriff and First Aid trailers will be located on Washington St. across from Katy's Cafe and Madigan's.

**CELL SERVICE:** Have a plan if the towers go down. Know where to meet if you are separated.

**VENDORS:** Must display vendor & health dept. permits on tents and must park in the designated lots provided to you by the Chamber. Sandwich boards, tables/chairs, merchandise, will not be allowed on sidewalks & tree lawns as to keep open to line of site for emergency personnel. Vendors are responsible for removal of their trash.

Help make Fall Festival safe and enjoyable, if you see something illegal, report it, if you see a mess, clean it up. Play by the rules, the future of Fall Fest depends on it.

## Letter to the Editor

### Cancer Services Program of WNY Spreads the Word for Early Screenings

Dear Editor, The Cancer Services Program (CSP) of Steuben, Allegany, Cattaraugus and Chautauqua Counties wants to spread the word that mammograms are the best way to find breast cancer early when treatment may work best. Research shows that women who get screened regularly for breast cancer with a mammogram are more likely to find breast cancer early. Finding breast cancer early means these women are less likely to need surgery and chemotherapy

and are more likely to be cured. Women who are at average risk for breast cancer and are ages 50 to 74 should get screened at least every two years. In New York State, breast cancer is the most common cancer and the second leading cause of cancer deaths among women. However, screening is much lower for women who do not have health insurance or who do not have a regular health care provider. This is where the CSP may be able to help. If you are 50 or older and don't have health insurance,

call the CSP at 877-778-6857 to find out if you qualify for free breast cancer screening. The CSP strongly encourages anyone who is due or overdue for a mammogram to schedule one today. ## The Bob McCarthy Foundation

### Ellicottville Rotary Foundation for Youth & Family Support Change Name



The Rotary Club of Ellicottville Foundation for Youth and its affiliate, Family Support for Ellicottville are excited to announce that they are changing their name to "The Bob McCarthy Foundation". As most of you know this 501c3 charitable foundation is dedicated to acting as a bridge between families and supportive assistance while supporting youth in our community.

With input from the community The Board of the Foundation, felt that the time is right to transition these two entities into a single Foundation to focus more precisely on our mandate. This move to consolidate both under a single Foundation will not change their mandate, but will help streamline efforts and expand community involvement. The Foundation is not very old but our roots come from two other support groups with a long history of assistance in Ellicottville. The Rotary Foundation for Youth was chartered in 2005 to help fund a Youth Center at the Ellicottville Memorial Library. This center in the Holiday Valley auditorium has hosted numerous Youth programs in a wide array of disciplines. In 2008 a critical local support group, the Family Support Center at ECS closed. Simultaneously the local Salvation Army folded that year as well. The Salvation Army local chapter

had been working with The Family Support center for years. They were dedicated to helping families in the ECS school district working with many Catt County agencies. With the hole created here a number of local volunteers stepped forward to fill the void. In early 2009 a small group met with the Foundation for Youth Board to decide how to fill the void. At that point the Family Support Affiliate was established under the Rotary Foundation for Youth.

This affiliate provided an outlet for those willing to donate time, goods and money to this 501c3 organization. Our mission to provide help and guidance to those in need, confidentially, while trying to structure help to be self-sustaining. We commit to ensure that 100% of the donations that are made go back into the Ellicottville community without any administrative cost. As such we are a completely volunteer organization.

Over the years in conjunction with the local Rotary Club, we conducted numerous fundraisers many created by the "Mad" genius of the Voice of Ellicottville, Bob McCarthy. Bob a long-term teacher of Special Ed students in Buffalo and a ski coach in Ellicottville moved to Ellicottville, his winter home, after retirement. Bob's fun fundraisers like Celtic Thunder, Americana Folk Art & Music Fair, Farm Fest, Snowboard Auction and many more continue to be that of local lore.

His most recognized event Irish Christmas was started to provide funding for Family Support's "Santa's Workshop helping families at Christmas. After his passing in June of 2016 the Foundation, renamed this wonderful evening "Bob McCarthy's Irish Christmas". This event now provides the bulk of the funding for Family Support

and bridged the Covid years with an online replacement. We are excited to announce that we will go back to a Live event at EBC on Friday December 9th. Some great changes are in the works to renew the event but the theme will remain the same in Bob's honor, so stay tuned.

Although this community is blessed with good fortune, many families struggle providing basic needs in the home. These difficulties put a strain on family finances, emotions, health and schedules. Therefore, families may require some extra patience and understanding while certain issues are worked through and hopefully healed. The Foundation focuses on identifying the needs through the school and other agencies in tune with the issues that families face.

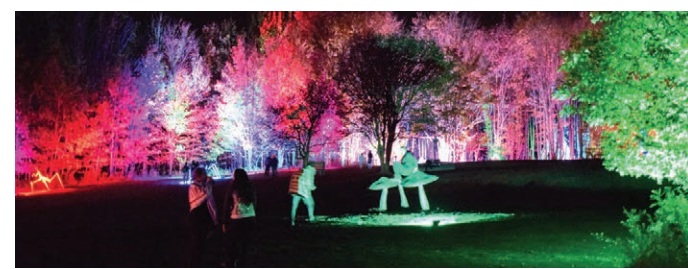
From this we support many varied programs like: The local Ellicottville food pantry, Support for individual students to help level the playing field financially, Help for broken families, Support for families who cannot pay for heat, food or clothing, Support for seasonal workers to bridge the gap between jobs, Help for victims of acts of God and ongoing health issues and many more.

Our only means of finance are from fundraisers, donation boxes in local business and individual donations. Your participation and donations at Irish Christmas make this happen. We are excited about this change and look forward to continued work in the community and stress the we want to reach out and invite your input and invite you to join us in our mission. ## Making Your Way Down Mardi Gras

The temperature is dropping and the trees around Ellicottville are starting to make their annual transition to bright reds and yellows, which can only mean one thing...Fall Festival is almost here! One of the best ways to take in the sights and festivities of Fall Festival is from atop Holiday Valley.

The Mardi Gras high speed quad will start running at 12PM to take people to the top. The ride itself generally takes less than 10 minutes from the time you load your chair to the time you unload at the top. Up to four people can be on a chair (dogs, backpacks/coolers are not permitted on the chairlift).

On the summit you can hike around the tops of some of your favorite winter runs, take in the fall colors, capture those mandatory fall foliage selfies and enjoy the food and drinks while you enjoy the tunes of live music that will be playing all weekend from noon to 4PM. When the time comes to make your way back down to the base, there are two great options. You can take the lift down, which, at times, could result in having to wait in line at the top to get on



the lift. The Mardi Gras quad downloading only allows for a 50% load capacity. That means four people can be loaded on every other chair or two people can be loaded on every chair. Either way, getting back to the bottom is a more time-consuming process than getting to the top. This lift was designed to get skiers and riders to the top but not to take people on a round trip. There has to be less overall weight on the download than the upload.

The other option to get back down is to hike, which might actually get you back down faster than the chairlift (and for those of you who might've

had one drink too many or eaten an extra hot dog even though you knew you didn't need it, the mile-long trek down Mardi Gras will help get you prepared for the activities that you have planned later on that evening).

Whether you ride the lift or hike, please be considerate and throw out any trash you have in the provided trash receptacles. Help keep our slopes litter free! We're looking forward to another fantastic Fall Festival here in Ellicottville and hope to see you at the top of Mardi Gras and at the Cabana Bar from 4 - 7PM as we enjoy the fall season.

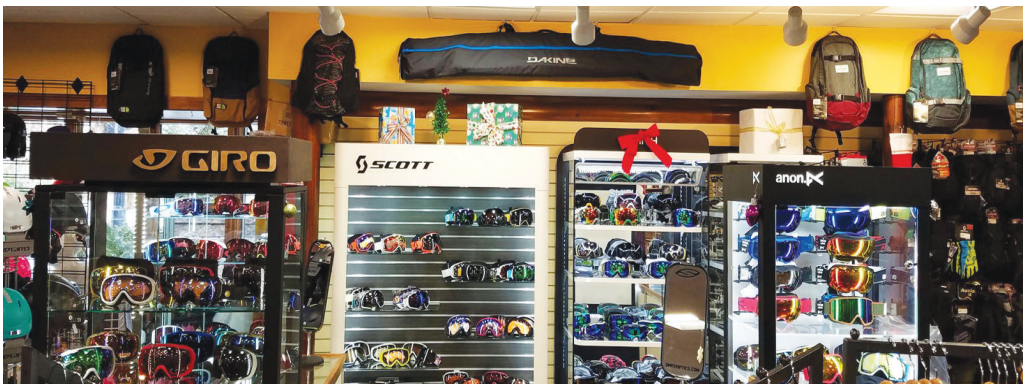

After purchasing your lift tickets online, take a screenshot of the code that you need to scan at the PUB machine (just in case you aren't able to get good cell

reception once you arrive in town). Dress appropriately. You never know what October weather will bring so hope for the best but come prepared for anything. Have proper footwear. You might just end up hiking up (or down) a ski slope. The right shoes make all the difference. Dogs, backpacks and coolers are not allowed on the chairlift.

This year, music and food/drinks will be back at the top of Mardi Gras. Food/drinks at the top of Mardi Gras will be cash only purchases. There will be an ATM at the top of Mardi Gras for your convenience.

Music will be playing at the top of Mardi Gras from 12-4PM and at the Cabana Bar from 4-7PM. The Mardi Gras lift runs from 12 - 4PM. Children age 6 and under are free to ride the lift.

W.I.L.M.A. Annual Event in Little Valley, October 15 & 16

You are probably familiar with the alleged weather-predicting power of the groundhog in the spotlight on Groundhog Day. Every February 2nd, at Gobbler's Knob in Punxsutawney, Pennsylvania, crowds gather to see whether a groundhog sees its shadow, because if it does, according to legend, there will be six more weeks of winter.

Well, move over, Punxsutawney Phil, and meet Wilma the Woolly Bear, the mascot of the upcoming W.I.L.M.A. weekend in Little Valley, NY. It is not a bear but rather the Isabella tiger moth caterpillar, a bug that can supposedly predict the harshness of winter. W.I.L.M.A. stands for "We Invite Local Manufacturing and Artisans" and the 10th annual event showcases the products of local manufacturers and artisans in Cattaraugus County. It will be held, rain or shine (indoors) at the Cattaraugus County Fairgrounds on Saturday, October 15th from 10-4pm and on Sunday, October 16th, from 11-3pm.

Isabella tiger moth caterpillars, commonly called woolly bears and also woolly worms, have black and brown segments on their bodies, and the bigger their brown bands are in autumn, the milder the winter is supposed to be. If their "hair" is thicker, the winter is expected to be harsher. (However, the caterpillar is typically not very accurate). At the W.I.L.M.A. event, you'll get a chance to see what an actual woolly bear predicts for this winter. You can also enter Chinese Auction raffles, sip cider, eat donuts, and enjoy lots more! All the vendors at the annual

event are always Cattaraugus County business owners, manufacturers, artisans or crafters. The tables will display items ranging from wreaths, jams & jellies, hats & scarves, signs and soaps to cheese, candles, baskets, barrettes, blankets, burp cloths, and bags.

All the vendors that will be present at this year's event (this list is not available online) include: Milk House Country Crafts (floral wreaths, candles and other decor), Jane's Crafty Creations (a wide variety of items), Baskets Plus (homemade wooden baskets), Char's Creations (primitive sewing, dips and mixes), Jean's Jams & Jellies (jams and jellies, plus relishes and sauces), Papa's Products (wooden items such as scroll art, pens and toys), Aunt Deb's Hot Mustard, Simply Slates (hand-painted slate art), If Unique Is What You Seek (fabric ornaments, pens and barrettes), Help Me Help Others (Priscilla Snider sells fabric-crafted items and donates the proceeds to various charitable organizations), Creative Escapes by Jamie (wooden signs), Eden Valley Creamery (cheese), Hot Off the Hooks (crocheted items including hats & scarves), Fat Root LLC, (which sells honey, horseradish and garlic), Nancy Bowers Crafts (handmade dolls and blankets), Bell, Book & Vinyl (bookmarks, tote bags, ornaments and signs), Empty Nest Creations (rice warming-bags, blankets and burp cloths), FZL Designs (wood art), The She Garage (shirts and tumblers), J & L Designs (jewelry, hand cream, dish towels and more), Clare's County Creations (candles, knitted items and blankets), Hoofbeat Designs Leather Co. (wallets, dog collars, and tote bags), Photo Art by Sophia

(photo art, soap & jewelry), Gail Wulf's Crafts, Badger & Butterfly Earth Creations (face-painting, gems & fossils), Rustic Originals (primitive and country decor), Dee's Creations (wreaths), and Joyce Louser, who sells towels, necklaces and baby blankets.

Christine Urf, Development Specialist for the Cattaraugus County's Department of Economic Development, said "This weekend of family-oriented fun is a great opportunity for local manufacturers and artisans to showcase their items, made right in Cattaraugus County. It's also a great opportunity to get started on holiday shopping. We began this event to encourage people to 'shop local and buy local', supporting small businesses. This is WILMA's tenth year and each year it's expanded."

Remember, whatever you buy, you are helping to the community's businesses to thrive and showing your support. Every vendor donates a door prize Gift Basket and pays a registration fee and a table fee. A 10' X 10' vendor space costs \$20, and a table is rented for \$10, if it is available. (There are a limited number). Each vendor is only allowed to offer local home-made items (they must be made in Cattaraugus County), local crafts and services or items from a local manufacturer.

# Tribute: Ellicottville's Carl Kirchner

Five-Foot Six yet Larger than Life

Previously unknown to me, I had the opportunity to "meet" Carl Kirchner posthumously, through the stories told by his long-time fiancée, Alison Edwards. This perpetually on-the-move guy got stopped in his tracks on May 12 driving one of his beloved Harley's when he hit a deer on Maples Road. Although he survived the accident while properly helmeted, Carl sustained traumatic brain injury and succumbed on September 22, 2022. He was 68.

Born in Niagara Falls, NY, Carl lived in Sanborn and Lockport (where he got his start in the ski industry at Snowflake Ski Shop, then Kissing Bridge) until 21 years ago when he moved to Ellicottville to manage the Holiday Valley Mountain Shops. He knew the sports clothing industry well and could generally find exactly what a customer needed. He loved skiing, so he naturally had first-hand knowledge of the demands on the clothing to keep a customer comfortable and warm.

In the summers, Carl worked at American Harley Davidson in North Tonawanda, and at Gowanda Harley Davidson. He knew the Harley bikes inside and out, so he proved to be a valuable employee and a great resource for his Hog motorcycle buddies. When he wasn't working, he was doing things around the house or he and Alison were off on a motorcycle adventure, near or far. They particularly loved heading off to New Hampshire on the 34.5-mile Kancamagus Highway in northern NH that is known as one of the best fall foliage viewing areas in

the country (but then, there is Ellicottville, right?). It's no wonder they loved the area between the scenery, the covered bridges, and the New Englanders' friendliness. Of course, Alison relates that Carl knew no strangers, just friends he hadn't met. "No matter where we traveled, even out of state, Carl would bump into someone he knew."

Carl was quite a character, in a good way. He would draw people into conversation, sometimes even when they didn't want to engage. Usually a very happy guy, Alison was told by a friend that "Carl could be 'annoying,' but the kind of annoying you can't help but love." Alison said that "Carl had a BIG personality and those around him loved to feed off it. And he loved that." An unrestrained hugger, and firm, warm handshaker, he loved life and greeted it head on, with an optimistic smile.

Carl's optimism was put to the test when his 11-year-old son, Daniel, sustained a head injury playing baseball. X-rays revealed a life-threatening tumor, which Daniel fought for a period, ultimately succumbing two days before 9/11. The double tragedy left Carl reeling but with time and compassionate friends, Carl pulled himself together and continued with what may have been his life-purpose, to be a spirit of love and humor and friendship to those around him. As Alison pointed out, "when Carl was in town, everyone knew he was there." He loved life and was always genuinely happy to see and talk with people. He quickly made friends and continued to keep in contact, even long distance. Carl was always fun to be around, but moreover, he was loving and



caring, and did not hesitate to show it. A problem solver, Carl was also an intent listener, offering sound advice when asked.

Carl loved good food, especially anything Italian paired with his favorite Titos vodka and soda. He enjoyed the Buffalo Bills but more so enjoyed being a spectator at hockey. A blues fan and all-around music lover, he enjoyed hanging at Balloons on Blues Night, even getting up to dance, and encouraging others to join, in his most charming, yet persuasive way.

Carl leaves behind a daughter, Jenna Kirschner of Canandaigua, and two beloved grandchildren, Piper (5) and Lincoln (8) Corley. He will be greatly missed by Alison's 13-year-old daughter Ainsley, who looked at Carl as her stepdad since Alison and Carl started dating right after Ainsley's birth. Alison smiles and chuckles talking about Carl's peculiarities and antics, but she acknowledges the bigger-than-life hole left in

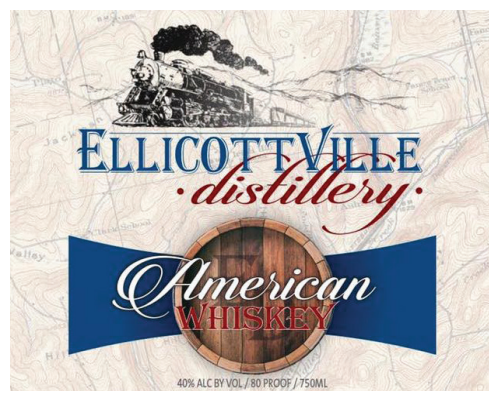

# Expansions

STORY FROM COVER

Both of our ski areas have been busy this year. Offering year-round fun and activities, making improvements to each, building big plans for the future. There is always something happening. *The Villager* spoke with Director of Marketing for Holiday Valley, **Dash Hegeman** and Sales/Marketing Director for HoliMont, **Jennah Bradley** about each resort's most notable improvements for 2022 so far.

**Holiday Valley Resort:**

*The Villager:* Dash, could you let us know the most notable changes for Holiday Valley Resort this year?

*Dash:* "Holiday Valley has invested over \$5 million in improvement projects throughout this past summer as we prepare for the 2022-23 winter season. The improvement highlights include the purchase of a new PistenBully 600 Groomer, continued upgrades to the snowmaking system, RFID ticket scanning, slope work and the start of construction on a brand-new high speed 6 pack chairlift, which will be completed in the summer of 2023."

"Direct-to-lift RFID ticketing and scanning will allow guests to purchase their tickets online, print out a reusable lift ticket (or season pass) at one of our Pick-Up Box (PUB) locations throughout the resort and go directly to the lift without having to wait in line at a ticket booth. RFID stands for Radio Frequency Identification Device and the "device" is a small chip that is integrated into the lift ticket. The chip contains information pertaining to the product a guest purchased and tells our



HoliMont's Trail Crew was able to complete and open 1.88 miles of new trails this summer in addition to maintenance and improvements on many of their current trails. The growing trail system has increased the traffic at the Bike Park and in response they have increased the turnaround with twice as many bike carriers allowing them to cycle more than 165 bikes per hour to the top.

scanning system that the ticket or pass is valid. The cards have an expected multi-year lifespan, which means whether you are a season pass holder or a day ticket purchaser, you can reuse your card for the duration of its lifespan. The multi-year durability of the new RFID cards will drastically reduce Holiday Valley's environmental impact in comparison to the use of the old day tickets and season pass cards."

"The new groomer replaces an older machine to maintain Holiday Valley's modern fleet, which are used to recondition the snow surface every night. The new machine is more fuel efficient and produces lower emissions than the one it replaces. Snowmaking is key to the successful operation of Holiday Valley. Holiday Valley is able to make snow on 95% of its 300 acres of slopes, with approximately 50% of its 715 snowguns equipped with automation."

"And finally, The Mardi Gras 6 pack chairlift project will be the first 6 pack lift in the Western New York region. This past summer, the

Mountain Operations team worked to set the concrete foundations for the lift towers in the ground. That will allow the team to get an early start on the construction of the lift in the spring of 2023. Once the 2022-23 winter season comes to an end, work will begin to take down the existing Mardi Gras high speed quad, which will then be followed by the building of the new 6 pack lift. The target date for opening of the 2022-23 season is Friday, November 25, weather permitting."

**HoliMont Resort:**

*The Villager:* Jennah, what's happened at HoliMont this year so far and what are your plans looking ahead?

*Jennah:* "As we roll into the fall and winter months, we are excited to see some frosty mornings, and are so grateful for our HoliMont Family. It is hard to believe this coming weekend, Fall Festival, October 8/9, 2022 will be the final weekend for the HoliMont Bike Park this season. The feedback from our members and guests has been

# Villaggio

“Villaggio started when Cheryl and Randy Kane visited me at our first restaurant, Osteria 166 in Buffalo. Cheryl asked if I’d ever considered coming back to Ellicottville, and at first, I wasn’t sure. I was a bit overwhelmed with one restaurant, but the idea stuck with me. Fast forward a few months, I visited Ellicottville on Father’s Day, as we frequently did, with my wife and young daughters. On that fateful day, I made a left on Monroe Street with the idea churning in my head and told my wife I wanted to show her something. As we walked into 7 Monroe Street (formerly The Barn) I asked her what she thought of this location for ‘another Osteria’ and she began to cry. I wasn’t sure if they were good tears or bad tears when she responded “Why didn’t we move to Ellicottville when we moved back to Western New York? I knew they were good tears, and the start of a wonderful chapter in our lives. We are forever grateful to Cheryl and Randy Kane who made it possible for us to raise our daughter, Olivia in my hometown, and for starting the story of Villaggio.” Villaggio is simply named for the village of Ellicottville. “I absolutely love our Village. It is exactly where I wanted to raise my family and spend my remaining years. It takes a village to be who we are.”

The menu is similar to Villaggio’s sister restaurant in Buffalo (Osteria 166), but with a few less dishes. “We had to take the size of the kitchen, the seating capacity, and the seasonality of the operations into account. The small kitchen keeps the actual number of dishes offered lower than Osteria 166. With three times the seats and half



the kitchen space of Osteria, we needed to reevaluate. We also have certain things we love to serve, but cannot serve in season. Pizzas, are a great example of this. Although we love our pizzas, we don’t have space for a proper pizza oven, so we have to use our main oven. Yet we also use the oven for several other dishes. If we leave pizzas on in ski season, the oven is opened and closed too frequently to hold its proper temperature, thus slowing down service. We are working on a plan to install a new pizza oven in 2023. Taking these things into consideration, as well as our Italian roots, we settled on a menu that we feel confident in. And we run extensive specials weekly. Some of which remind me of coming to The Barn in the 70’s, like our prime rib Sundays.” Villaggio has certainly evolved over the years, and has become much more stable and efficient in its operations while still staying true to its roots. “We are an Italian restaurant in a resort town, with family recipes at our core. But we also have to adjust to the seasonality of our village. Our locals are our life line. Without the locals we would not still be standing. So, we try and make our menu approachable to the local community all year. Another reason for our evolution is the amazing staff we have. We have had very little turnover throughout the first 7 years, with many

current employees being opening team members. The personal growth of these employees has made us better each and every year. No one exemplifies this more than our General Manager, Andrea Austin. Her personal development is reflected in the growth of the operation, along with several other team members.” Villaggio has hosted several events throughout the years. “One of my favorites was our Grand Opening 7 years ago. Under a time constraint to get open (we did a complete remodel in 27 days), we were struggling with the ability to properly train our staff. So, I invited the whole town to dinner! We bought everyone’s meals, and EVERYONE showed up. We learned so much that night, that we were able to figure out our service and prepare for fall fest two days later. Other favorite events include our fundraisers, hoedowns, concerts, street dancers and proms.”

Nick is proud of his staff, many of which are third generation. “We have legacy families that appreciate how we treat their oldest sibling, and the upcoming brothers and sisters come on board for their first job. They often stay throughout their time in Ellicottville and have made Villaggio what it is today.” According to Nick, Villaggio has many unique features. “My two favorites are the

# 1st Brocton Arch Festival

Village Of Brocton, NY Welcomes Arch Festival, October 15th



**A double arch for Brocton was approved by the Portland Centennial Association in 1913, the 100th birthday of the town. Believed to be the only remaining four-way street arch in the United States today, it was posted to the National Register of Historic Places on February 22, 1996.**

Village of Brocton mayor Craig Miller was working on rehabilitation of the gazebo in Ryckman Park when he had a vision of a festival to bring the community together.

“It’s a beautiful park and a festival would be a great way to draw attention to it. The Arch Festival name highlights one of the community’s best assets—the arches.”

A fast-growing Village of Brocton wanted a symbol of its prosperity as home of the Concord Grape. Municipal arches bearing community names were popular, and a double arch for Brocton was approved by the Portland Centennial Association in 1913, the 100th birthday of the town. Believed to be the only remaining four-way street arch in the United States today, it was posted to the National Register of Historic Places on February 22, 1996.

The Village of Brocton will host its inaugural Arch Festival on Saturday,

October 15, from 11-5pm at Ryckman Park on Fay Street. Members of the festival committee include Miller; Village Trustee Kari Doyno; and Ahira Hall Memorial Library personnel—director Julie Morrison Patcher, assistant director Merrie Hanmann, and staff member MariBeth Patterson. Hanmann designed the arch logo for the festival.

In preparing for the Arch Festival, members of the committee have been gathering additional historical information about the arches that will be shared with the community.

“I’m a big fan of beautification,” Miller says. “The kiosk in front of City Hall was rotting badly. I had it torn down and rebuilt.” He credits village employees who were an integral part of the process—Patrick McCloskey, Jimmy Dolce, and Joe Majkowski, who was able to wire it with original lighting from the arch. Historical signs were

also damaged; Miller wants to replace them with new photos based on history of the arches.

“Since I’ve been mayor, we’ve had nothing but positive comments,” he says of his interest in beautification. Miller was village trustee for seven years, deputy mayor one year. He became mayor after former mayor Art Miller (no relation) resigned in mid-May. The area opposite Village Hall, Arch Park, is overgrown and neglected, he says. “I’m going to have all that torn out and have a community garden there next spring.”

The gazebo in Ryckman Park has been a target for vandals and a crew has just been hired to put on new roof. The village is looking into a grant for a security camera, he says. He also hopes the park will get greater appreciation and use. Ahira Hall Library currently sponsors summer concerts in the park.

The village is charging \$20 for vendors to set up at the Arch Festival, with proceeds going to the Brocton-Portland Food Pantry and the Ahira Hall Memorial Library.

In addition, the Brocton Volunteer Fire Department will be selling hot dogs, hamburgers, and chili to raise funds for the fire department. The village hopes to continue the festival in the future. Contact the village office at (716) 792-4160 for more information.

## East Otto Historical Museum

# Health & Science: Asteroid Defense

## First Ever Test of Asteroid Defense System Successful

Hollywood has created plenty of dooms-day asteroid and comet movies, some with saved-the-world endings, others not so much (Don't Look Up). The truth about asteroids according to real scientists, is the possibility of a catastrophic size rock blazing through the inner solar system with Earth in its path, is a matter of when, not if. This week, these scientists are ecstatic that a plan to try to push an asteroid out of the way is one step closer to reality. This past Monday, after travelling 7-million miles, NASA's DART (Double Asteroid Redirection Test) interplanetary probe literally crashed into an asteroid called Dimorphos at a speed of 14,760 miles per hour, to determine if the impact would change its orbit around another larger asteroid called Didymos. While everyone knows NASA for its progress in space flight, the International Space Station, and ambitious projects like the Webb Telescope, the agency also has a vast program for planetary defense strategies. These programs, such as the Near-Earth Object

Surveyor, historically searched for potentially dangerous or problematic asteroids. DART is the first ever mission to shove aside an asteroid to determine if this approach may work on an asteroid that may harm earth. So far, the mission's one-way trip confirmed NASA can successfully navigate a spacecraft to intentionally collide with an asteroid to deflect it, a technique known as kinetic impact. The targeted binary asteroid system is considered near-Earth, however neither asteroid is a threat to our planet. The pair of asteroids is basically being used for target practice to discern whether the 570-kilogram mass (12,260 pounds) of the robotic spacecraft plus the speed of the impact would be enough force to push the small Dimorphos into a different orbit around Didymos. The DART mission launched last November 23. After ten months traveling toward its target, the school bus sized probe smashed Dimorphos at the exact calculated time of 7:14 pm EST Monday night, marking a huge step forward in protecting the earth from a potentially catastrophic asteroid impact. The spacecraft sent back real time photos of the approaching asteroid, until the point of impact when the screen went blank. NASA

project workers watching live, burst into cheers at the total destruction of their spacecraft. Over the coming weeks, they will study the ejected material produced by the impact; and precisely measure Dimorphos' movement to determine how effectively DART changed its orbit. The results will help confirm and improve scientific computer models critical to predicting whether this technique is a reliable method for deflection in the event a dangerous future asteroid is on a path toward Earth. In addition, in a few years the European Space Agency is sending a probe to the asteroids to study them up close for even more precise information. Given the most widely accepted theory of mass extinction that killed the dinosaurs was an asteroid impact, scientists agree, the effort and 330 million dollars are worth it. Currently, more than 27,500 near-Earth asteroids are documented, none of which pose a threat. However, scientists have only found about 40% of the largest ones that could be out there.

Lindley Johnson, NASA's Planetary Defense Officer says DART's success is an essential addition to the toolbox needed to protect the earth from a devastating asteroid impact, "This demonstrates we are no longer powerless to prevent this type of natural disaster." Indeed, she says, the NASA Near-Earth Object Surveyor, plus a DART successor, could allow scientists "to save the day." Exactly how much the asteroid orbit changed, will be determined sometime in the next few weeks, following observations and analysis.

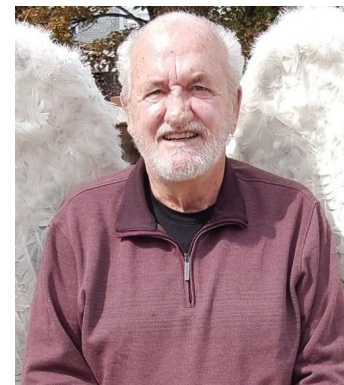
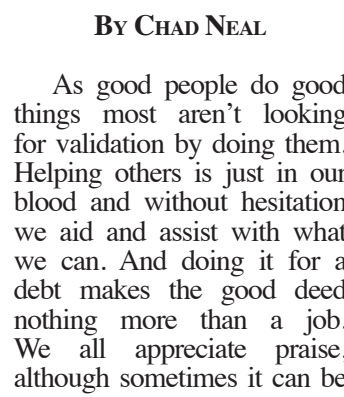

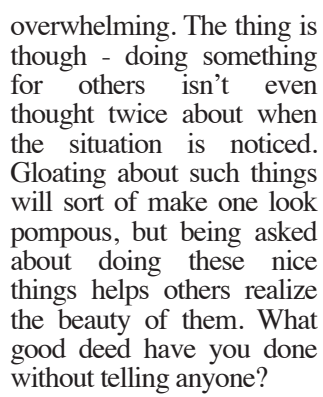

past experiences. According to Toth's website, "He saw in their story a parallel to the violent repression he had experienced in Hungary." There is a Toth sculpture in every one of the United States, Canada and now in Europe, totaling 74. He does not charge for them as he considers them a gift to his new country. The Dunkirk sculpture is located at the North side of Route 5 (Lakeshore Drive) at the intersection of Pike St.

Another larger-than-life character is the loveable cartoon Great Dane, Marmaduke. His creator, Brad Anderson, was from Portland, in honor of Brad and Marmaduke, Portland has erected a life-sized statue honoring them on Route 20 (87 West Main Street). The dog and comic are playfully featured in this statue. Having been born in Jamestown, it seemed appropriate that Anderson's studio was re-created for the National Comedy Center in Jamestown. The donated studio includes Anderson's original drawing board and materials. His studio is among great company with Carl Reiner's career archives and the Betty White collection displayed there.

Jamestown and the area have many Lucille Ball sites to visit. Look for the Lucy murals on various buildings

around downtown. You can't miss the Vitameatagavegamin Postcard on the side of a parking garage (corner of 3rd and Spring streets). Plan to visit the National Comedy Center and the Lucille Ball-Desi Arnaz Museum (203 W. 2nd Street) where the history of American comedy resides. "See why visitors and the media are raving about this one-of-a-kind experience, recently selected by USA Today as the "Best New Museum" in the country, and by TIME as one of its "World's Greatest Places." (comedycenter.org)

Four miles from the Comedy Center you can visit Lucy's final resting place at Lakeview Cemetery. Look for the big heart on a large black stone. Head to Celoron (2.6 miles west to Lucille Ball Memorial Park) to enjoy the Lucy statues. Here you'll find my favorite, Dave Poulin's "Ugly Lucy" as she is endearingly referred to, as well as the new Lucy statue erected in 2016. Funny thing about our beloved "Ugly Lucy" - she looks much like the adored Bronze Lucy who has sat on a bench in Palm Springs, CA. since 1995, ready for photo ops.

While in Celoron, look for the historic Celoron lighthouse to get some memorable photos of the area.

You can't leave Chautauqua County without visiting the Chautauqua Institution. Founded 174 years ago, it is on the National Register of Historic Places featuring

some of the most ornate Victorian architecture around. Although programming is done for the season, the grounds are open for visitors daily 6am-6pm., no passes required. Chautauqua Bookstore is open daily 9am-5pm except holidays. The Athenaeum Hotel, the Grande-dame of Chautauqua Institution is beautifully designed in the French Second Empire style. Even if you don't stay, it's worth a stroll-through or a sit in the rockers on the veranda. Although the summer program season is over for visitors to Lily Dale Assembly in Cassadaga folks can still visit with the resident mediums in the off months. (lilydaleassembly.org then click "find a medium"). Since it was established in 1879, Lily Dale has been the world's largest center for spiritual development and the practice of the Spiritualist religion.

Chautauqua Lake at an elevation of 1,308 feet (399 m) above sea level, is higher than any of the Finger Lakes and is one of the highest navigable lakes in North America. Used primarily for tourism and entertainment, the lake is known for its muskellunge fishing and sailing. The lake is mentioned in an episode of I Love Lucy when Lucy finds a stuffed and mounted fish in an attic trunk and muses that Ricky caught it at Chautauqua Lake! Of course!



The growing trail system has increased the traffic at the Bike Park and in response we have increased the turnaround with twice as many bike carriers allowing us to cycle more than 165 bikes per hour to the top. Look for the New Jump Trail we are planning to have on Opening Day 2023 next season.

Looking back on this season, with the addition of our Skills Area near the base of Sunset we were able to add three 2-day Mountain Bike Camps for riders 7 and older to learn and grow their skills in mountain biking. For the more seasoned riders we have hosted 3 DH Races and one XC Race. Over 200 athletes took part in these events, and we are looking forward to growing these events and programs for the upcoming season. Weekly

Race Series, Private Lessons, and additional events are all being considered. Save the dates for these Winter Bike Events. Winter FUNnel - Fat Bike DH Race, February 19th, 2023

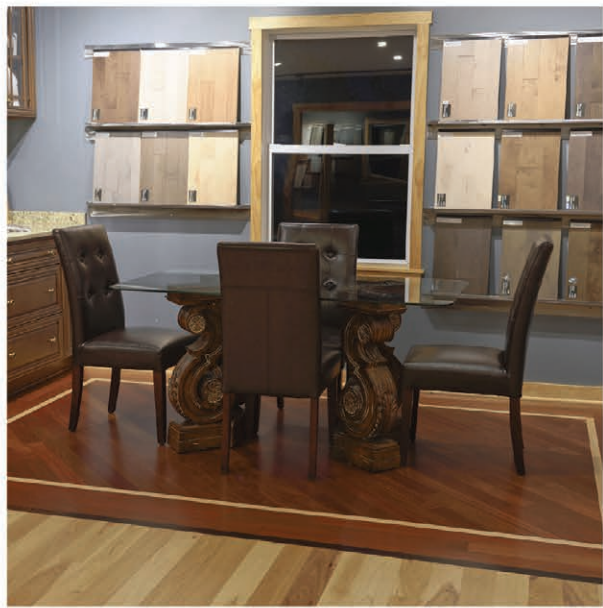
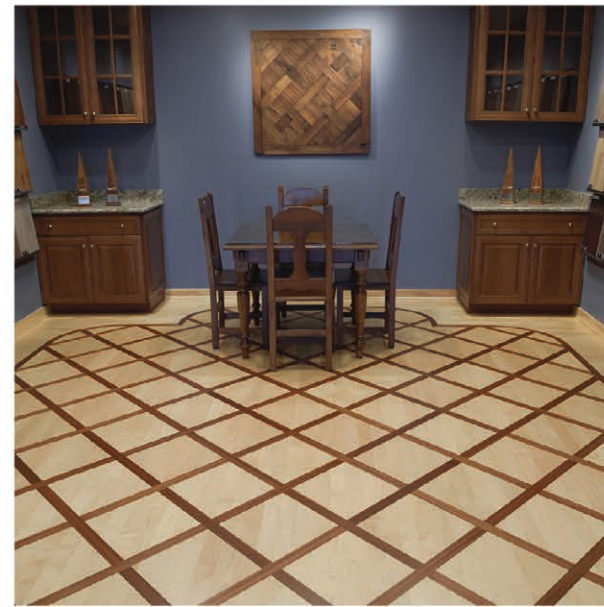
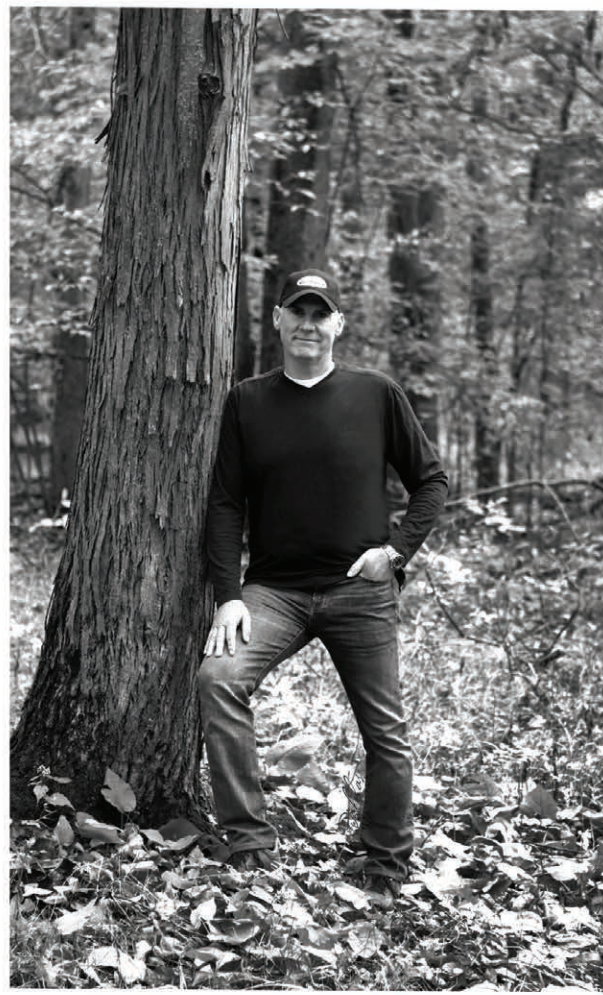

# INSIDER’S GUIDE TO FALL FESTIVAL

## History: Ellicottville Fall Festival - It was a Spark of Art

If memory serves me correctly, this year’s Fall Festival is the 47th. For most of us who live in the area, we have likely attended thirty/forty or more of them. That’s a lot of Holiday Valley Ski Patrol sausages with peppers and onions. My trick was to arrive very early and beat the crowds, getting first pick of artwork and Christmas.

Now the biggest event in Ellicottville, it began simply enough as a fall art show at Holiday Valley. It was brought down to the village in 1975 as a tiny seed of the massive production it has become. That first year a flatbed on wheels was parked in front of the post office featuring a German oompah band, complete with lederhosen attire,

possibly the people who had previously performed at Holiday Valley for their Oktoberfest. Folks on the street likely wore bell bottoms or bottom frayed jeans, maxi dresses, tie-dyed tee shirts and ponchos over their peasant blouses. We still felt like hippies, wearing chokers, headbands and jewelry made of wood staves, feathers or beads. Cool, man!

It’s difficult to imagine, but in those early years the Fall Festival was a sorely needed and much appreciated transfusion for the small businesses that dot our streets. Everyone was more than ready to welcome visitors to the village after spring “Mud Season” (a local term newcomers have never had cause to hear) and summer lean times. We were ready to welcome back

the many property owners who traditionally used this weekend to open and stock up their winter holiday homes. In the 70’s at least half of our village homes were owned by people from out of town. After the 80’s “boom” those numbers increased.

We have a couple of local gals to thank for their idea to bring the festival to town. Betty Kerns, grandmom to Balloon’s Michael Kerns, and John Rounds’ (Adventure Bound on the fly) mom, Heidi (now Widger) had the inspiration to bring Betty’s art show to the village and combine it with an annual fall antique show run by Dennie Signore. Yoked together, these events were the springboard for the event you enjoy today. This event provides opportunities for lodging and retail

establishments and restaurants in Ellicottville and neighboring communities, public service groups, churches, scouts, little league football/soccer teams, etc., to give a healthy boost to their treasuries, which was one of the driving forces for Widger and Kerns.

Ski swaps went back to the beginning along with the Holiday Valley chairlift rides. There were none to Spruce Lake at the time since the now popular lake wasn’t created for snowmaking until 2006. Currently, HoliMont Ski Club also is offering chair lift rides on Saturday from 11am-4pm.

In the village, I recall a giant red apple in front of the Historical Society Building that was situated there for years, providing

festival goers with sticky candied apple delights. Even back then, the beautiful flower barrels tended by our beloved Alley Katz lined the streets. I also remember being in front of the Inn with our little league football team selling hot dogs with frozen fingers as we stood in inches of new fallen snow! That’s Ellicottville!

To increase the fun, a trip to 200-acre Pumpkinville in Great Valley, was (and still is) a must. Started in 1968 by the Joe and Helen Halloran family, the Dan and Diane Pawlowski family took it over 27 years ago, enlarging its scope exponentially and extending their hours of operation (pumpkinville.com - 716-699-2205). Also, in conjunction with the Fall Festival is the spooky, hair-raising Sommerville Valley

Nightmare Hayride, the brainchild of the John and Karen Kent family, which has been part of the fun since 1990. (nightmarehayride.com – 716-699-4839)

A word of caution: the village is one-square mile. Thousands of visitors come for the festival and/or leaf-peeping. Fur babies would be best left in the quiet and safety of their own homes, especially if you want to ride the chair lifts. Animals, backpacks/coolers are not permitted on board.

In 47 years, we’ve definitely come a long way. Check the schedule in The Villager to be sure you get to participate in everything you’d like. Remember, this is a crazy, busy weekend. Enjoy, and please, be kind to your fellow humans, especially those who are working the event.
