The COVID-19 pandemic further delayed the café's grand opening; however, now in 2022 the café is finally operating in line with its original vision. New menu items have been slowly added and seating has been expanded,

Alison Duwe, worker owner with Art's Café, describes the food as flavorful and uncomplicated. "Our bread is naturally leavened. We source the bulk of our grains from Farmer Ground Flour near Ithaca. Our breads feature these stone-ground organic, flours. The breads taste you." The Cafe's seasonal menu rotates, featuring fresh produce, sandwiches breakfast items and including toasts, yogurts and egg sandwiches. Café beverages and bakery items are available all day, and beer and wine is now available.




