



#### Emergency Preparedness: Car Kits

Emergency survival kit backpacks for your vehicles – freshen and restock twice a year: N95 masks, Freshly updated first aid kit (include Quick Clot bandages which contain a blood clotting wound agent to help to speed up the clotting process), tourniquet, emergency solar light, compass, emergency crank radio, flashlight (get one that goes dormant than charges up with a shaking), emergency escape tool with knife, candles (9 hour), fire starters - hand sanitizer may contain alcohol – spread it (or Chapstick) all over wood and ignite. Chips (Fritos corn chips are best) will also work. Matches or lighter and several days of vital medicines in waterproof container; emergency space blankets/sleeping bag; starter cables, tarp, gloves, electrical and duct tape, rope, an axe, if you have room, back up phone charger (some hold a charge for months), flares, collapsible drinking cup, spare reading glasses, extra socks, hat and gloves, heavy duty work gloves. For nutrition add some trail mix, jerky snacks, energy bars, powdered milk, Gatorade or water (open and drain to ¾ so they don't freeze and burst if weather is cold).
