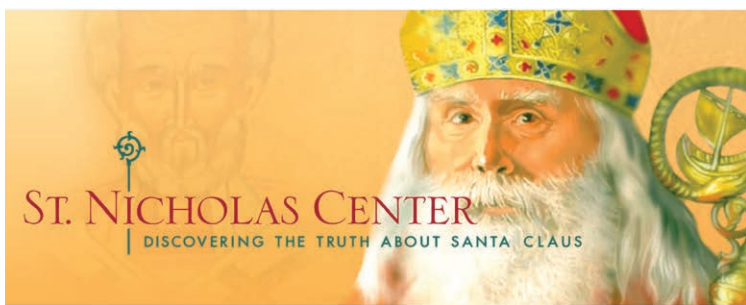

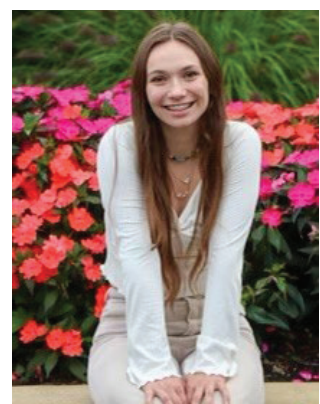

HoliMont Up Close

Debbie Stein Computed HoliMont's Future

Debbie Stein had a plan: Get a job at HoliMont and have the summers off so she could devote more time to her young family in the off-season. Debbie, however, posed a problem for HoliMont – the good type of problem! She immediately proved herself to be a vital cog in the HoliMont machine and has been working full time for 28 years! Debbie comes from nearby Otto, NY, attended school in the Village of Cattaraugus, has been married 41 years, and is the proud mother of two sons. Debbie grew up on a dairy farm and lives today with her husband on their own 225-acre farm where they have 125 head of Black Angus Beef. Debbie always had a strong aptitude for math, and these skills proved invaluable as Debbie straddled the two worlds of the family farm and the ski resort. Like every other business at the dawn of the computer age, HoliMont had to adapt to a new reality: the era of handwritten records was giving way to the era of complex computer skills. Debbie attended Jamestown Community College to hone her programming and overall computer skills. In 1996, HoliMont introduced its first payroll computer system powered by the DOS system. Debbie, seeing that someone needed to step up, had an



idea: She read DOS for Dummies! Do we see where this is heading? Debbie once again proved her value to HoliMont and took over the payroll job. This was, so to speak, only the first Gigabyte in Debbie's computer journey. A company from (where else!) Vermont called FCS was developing software for the ski industry. The program was called "Avatar Membership" and there were growing pains making the program work specifically for HoliMont. Once again, Debbie stepped forward to work with the programmers from Vermont to adapt the programs for HoliMont. At this time, Debbie was not the face behind the ticket booth, but as a modern version of the Wizard of Oz might say, "The woman behind the curtain." Working with FCS, she honed HoliMont's ticketing system for the computer age. HoliMont, despite being a private club with dues paying members, still relies on ticket sales

for a significant portion of its revenue. Once again, Debbie took it upon herself to be indispensable to HoliMont – she was still not getting summers off! Or winters! Several times Debbie has had to play HoliMont Super-Computer-Sleuth to discover why the ticketing system was not working minutes before HoliMont's lifts opened. Suspenseful? You bet. But Debbie always prevailed. Oh, and besides Debbie's role in modernizing HoliMont's computer systems, did we mention that she is also HoliMont's Human Resources Director? She has been at HoliMont for 28 years and has been the HR Director for 27 years. The HR job entails doing payroll, handling the benefits for HoliMont's 30 year-round employees, and participating in interviews. In the winter, the number of employees balloons to 400, and can even exceed

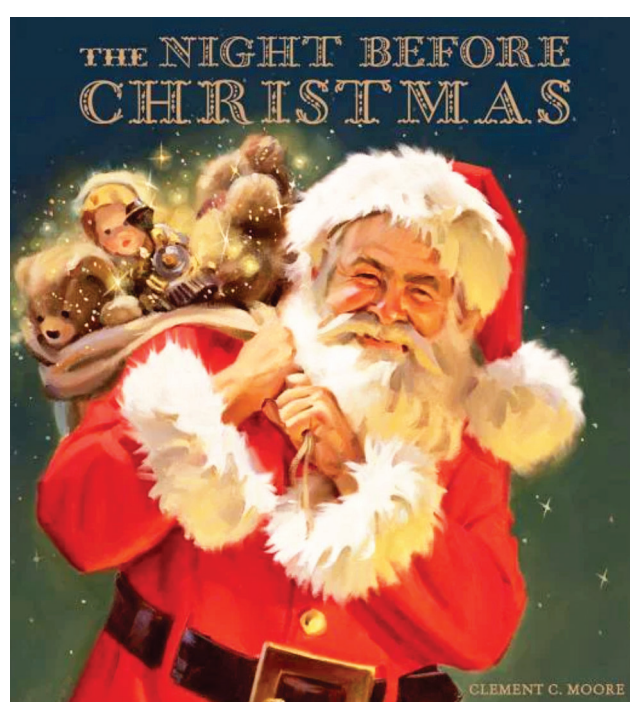

In 1823 the world was introduced to "a jolly old elf" in a poem, "A visit from St. Nicholas," which we all know as "The Night Before Christmas."

Pole, etc. An endless search through the myriad of rabbit holes at Google and elsewhere on the internet reveals many variations (most similar) about the Santa Claus story. Since this writer could find no one with first-person accounts about Nicolas or Santa, this was the next-best source of information. At a website called saintnicholascenter.org we quickly discover how Bishop (now "Saint") Nicholas morphed into the jolly figure we now all recognize as Santa Claus. Yes, there really was a live Saint Nicholas, whose memory was brought to The New World by the first Europeans, the Vikings and even Columbus who named a Haitian port for St. Nicholas in 1492. Legend has it that the first Dutch immigrant ship had a figurehead of St. Nicholas; that St. Nicholas Day was observed in the colony; that the first church was dedicated to him; and that St. Nicholas comes down chimneys to bring gifts. Even with the Protestant Reformation dissing St. Nick (and all saints), the common folk loved him and he survived along with the customs of placing nuts, apples and sweets in shoes (the precursor to the more sanitary sock by the fireplace) left by beds, doorways, or by the hearth. By 1810 St. Nicholas was still the prominent figure in Yule celebrations but then things got badly out of hand when Christmas as a holy season was eliminated and celebrations became akin to street fights among drunken men. But things slowly began to change. Kids gained a newer status in family. (In the end, it's always about our responsibility to our kids, isn't it?) Instead of an extra pair of work hands, it finally

came to pass that people recognized kids were, well, children, not mini-adults. Finally, St. Nicolas returned to center stage, distributing gifts and tenderness to the little ones. Mention of an alternate name for the saintly Nick fellow appeared in 1821 in a book called *Children's Friend*. In it, "Sante Claus flew in from the North seated in a sleigh pulled by flying reindeer." Several years later (1823) the world was introduced to "a jolly old elf" in a poem, "A visit from St. Nicholas," which we all know as "The Night Before Christmas." Washington Irving's St. Nicholas helped redefine the image of the regal St. Nicholas into a cozy, round, pipe-smoking, elf-like St. Nicholas. Other artists and writers continued the change to an elf-like St. Nicholas, "Sante Claus," or "Santa Claus," unlike the stately European bishop. In 1863, during the Civil War, political cartoonist Thomas Nast began a series of annual black-and-white drawings in Harper's Weekly, based on the descriptions found in the poem and Washington Irving's work. As Nast drew Santas until 1886, his work had considerable influence in forming the American Santa Claus. Along with appearance changes, the saint's name shifted to Santa Claus—a natural phonetic alteration from the German Sankt Niklaus. Here's a twist. Sunday schools (which were initially against Christmas festivities) emerged, teaching thousands of kiddoes about Christianity. But it wasn't a heralding angel that bought Christmas (or kids) into the classes. No, indeed, it was secular Santa, that jolly old elf, Christmas trees and gifts that increased attendance not only in Sunday School but in churches. So, who is this Santa Claus guy? How can he stick around so long? See Dolly and Kenny's words: "I believe in Santa Claus, I'll tell you why I do, 'Cause I believe that dreams and plans and wishes can come true, I believe in miracles, I believe in magic too, Oh, I believe in Santa Claus and I believe in you." Keep believing and Santa will be around forever. Merry Christmas!

of Skiing, page 100, they tell us, "The ski patrol was the first to carry the torches down Yodeler in the winter of 1958-59 to celebrate the New Year..." "The parade moved down Holiday Run led by Al Kohler in top hat and tails. Today {2002} the torch parade winds down Cindy's slope and can be viewed from the Club House Chalet." Dash Hegeman, Marketing Director at Holiday Valley who replaced Jane Eshbaugh after 41 years at Holiday Valley, (see article in Snow Industry News online archive, April 2022 "Holiday Valley Hires Marketing Director") tells us that "In January of 2008, we moved the Torchlight Parade from Cindy's back to Yodeler in celebration of Holiday Valley's 50th anniversary. There was a big party at the Yodeler Lodge in celebration of the milestone." In speaking with long-time skier, Corky Kantowski, he related how he had heard about the events at Holiday Valley (1958) and he and a friend came down for the weekend. They reserved rooms from Trudy Elsigan at the Edelweiss Lodge knowing there were not a lot of places to stay in Ellicottville. When they arrived, Trudy showed his friend his room, and then Trudy led Corky to a room, telling him to put his suitcase at one side of the bed because that would be where he would sleep. It seems the other side was rented to another skier, whom he did not know. He went to sleep on his side. When he awoke, he realized there was a body stirring next to him. The man turned to him and said, "Hi, I'm Dick Ferrick", and that's how they became friends for many years. The following

year, they stayed at Ellie and Dutch Roy's. The room was \$4.50 a night. His friend got a bed, but again, Corky was told, "we are overbooked." I can give you a chair to sleep in for \$4 a night, with breakfast included. Ahhhh, the good old days in that cute sleepy town called Ellicottville! Ski Patroller (now Western New York Ski Patrol Alumni Advisor), Joany Reynolds, shares the story about wearing maintenance coveralls during the torchlight parade. "The maintenance garage was near our Patrol Room. It was a guarantee that the sparks from the flares would leave our ski clothes spattered with tiny burn holes, so the coveralls protected us." Hegeman relates that "John Northrup remembers taking part in the parade in his youth and said the flares back then would almost always burn

a hole in your clothing." According to Kantowski, to this day, the flares are taped onto the handles of ski poles. At the final moment before descent, the flares are struck, and the thirty or so skiers head down. As Reynolds put it, "you hold your arms out like you are flying and begin to snowplow a zigzag down the hill." Imagine the sight of that giant sparkling S snaking down the hill. She remembers one skier who never liked to zig zag, came tearing straight down the hill, through the "S." Reynolds said, "it had to look like a huge dollar sign (\$) as he crossed through all of us." As for fireworks, Reynolds remembers one year (mid-sixties) when ski patrol director Bud Knapp and patroller Howard Cleveley took a box of

maintenance. Guests will find a new and improved ticketing system as well as new trail features and builds. Improvements this year include the purchase of a new PistenBully 600 Groomer in addition to the continued upgrades to the snowmaking system and slope work. The Holiday Valley crew has started construction on a brand-new high speed 6-pack chairlift, which will replace the current Mardi Gras high speed quad (to be completed in summer 2023). Dash Hegeman is the director of marketing at Holiday Valley and has been helping crews prepare for the opening. 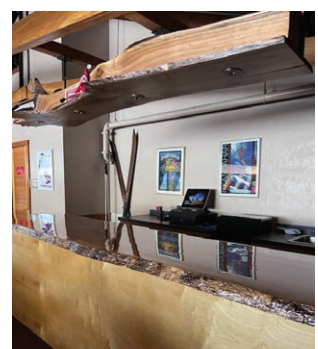

Big Win for Santa Sheriff 2022!!

Program from Catt. County Sheriff's Dept. Helps 54 Children

OLEAN, N.Y., December 12, 2022 — Once again this year school resource officers from the Cattaraugus County Sheriff's Department stuffed their shopping carts full of toys and clothes to bring Christmas to area families in need. This year the Santa Sheriff program served 17 families, representing a total of 54 area children.

For the last few years, the program has received most of its referrals through area school districts to school resource officers (SROs), said Sgt. Tonya Dry. This allows the program to better serve the children who benefit as the SROs are familiar with which children are most in need and have interactions with those children in school throughout the year. Sgt. Dry, who has served in a leadership role with the program since 2019, works closely with other area gift-giving programs and also takes referrals

for additional families to ensure that needy area families are assisted during the holidays. Since 2012, the Santa Sheriff Fund at CRCF has made possible over \$80,650 in grants in support of the Santa Sheriff Fund.

"The Santa Sheriff Program has been a steady source of support for area families in need for some time now," said CRCF Executive Director Karen Niemic Buchheit. "It touches your heart when you see the joy on the face of sheriff deputy shopping for the perfect coat or the perfect toy for a child. It is even more meaningful knowing that joy is only greater when a child sees that on Christmas morning."

EVL Village Board Meeting

Ellicottville Participates in Scenic Byway Kiosks

The Village of Ellicottville held its monthly Board meeting on December 20th. Mayor John Burrell announced some good news of a new large dump truck that was ordered by the Village is expected to arrive soon after many months of waiting. The Village's old dump truck will be sold and has several prospective buyers.

SCENIC BYWAY

The Mayor attended a WNY Southtowns Scenic Byway meeting on December 8th. At the Byway meeting, the future funds that will be made available to local communities from the Buffalo Bills Stadium project were discussed. The Byway committee developed a proposal to use these funds to place informational kiosks at the new Bills stadium to highlight the communities along the Byway. Mayor Burrell put forth a motion for the Village to be included in this project and the Village Board approved. Restore New York Grants

Governor Kathy Hochul announced the recipients of the first round of Restore New York grants on December 20th. The Village's application was not selected for this first round of funds that will distribute \$102 million to 64 community projects around the state. In Western New York, the communities of Westfield (\$1.5M), North Tonawanda (\$1.5M), and Olean (\$1.25M) were awarded funds for

community improvement projects. Applications for the second round of Restore New York funds are being accepted through January 27, 2023. The Village is still awaiting results for the New York Forward grant application. Consulting services to develop these applications for the New York Forward or Restore New York have cost the Village nearly \$20 thousand.

PLANNING BOARD APPLICATIONS

In the update from the Planning Department, Greg Keyser highlighted the applications being worked on by the department and the Planning Board. Applications that were detailed by Mr. Keyser were a Zoning Map amendment requested by Michael Nickolson for 39 Mill Street. A public hearing in January was approved by the Village Board. Also, a recent application for a cannabis lounge at 32 Washington Street received discussion along with the next steps for the Planning Board to form a committee to update the zoning codes to handle cannabis applications.

1-5 E. WASHINGTON STREET PLAZA

Mr. Keyser also reviewed a letter from Ellicott Development which owns the property at 1-5 East Washington Street and has submitted an application to the Planning Board for a change of use of the property to add the new Ratchet Hatchet location, Honig and Willig Law Firm, and a bakery to this

plaza. The letter also details plans for parking and requests a variance for parking requirements from the Village to fill the long-vacant spaces in the plaza.

STREET RECONSTRUCTION

Engineering Supervisor Ben Slotman detailed many of the Village and Town Engineering projects. Mr. Slotman and the Board also reviewed a request for proposal that will be released to receive bids for engineering services for Village Street reconstruction. The goal of this project will be to address the streets, sidewalks, and drainage of several problematic streets in the Village. The Mayor and Board also discussed future funding for any recommended drainage improvements which are expected to cost over \$2 million. The potential for a bond to finance the drainage improvements was discussed along with the potential tax impact.

RESIDENT CORRESPONDENCE

Before adjuring into the executive session, the Mayor and Board reviewed correspondence from residents. Emergency survival kit backpacks for your vehicles - freshen and restock twice a year: N95 masks, Freshly updated first aid kit (include Quick Clot bandages which contain a blood clotting wound agent to help to speed up the clotting process), tourniquet, emergency solar light, compass, emergency crank radio, flashlight (get one that goes dormant than charges up with a shaking), emergency escape tool with knife, candles (9 hour), fire starters - hand sanitizer may contain alcohol - spread it (or Chapstick) all over wood and ignite. Chips (Fritos corn chips are best) will also work. Matches or lighter and several days of vital medicines in waterproof container; emergency space blankets/sleeping bag; starter cables, tarp, gloves, electrical and duct tape, rope, an axe, if you have room, back up phone charger (some hold a charge for months), flares, collapsible drinking cup, spare reading glasses, extra socks, hat and gloves, heavy duty work gloves. For nutrition add some trail mix, jerky snacks, energy bars, powdered milk, Gatorade or water (open and drain to 3/4 so they don't freeze and burst if weather is cold).

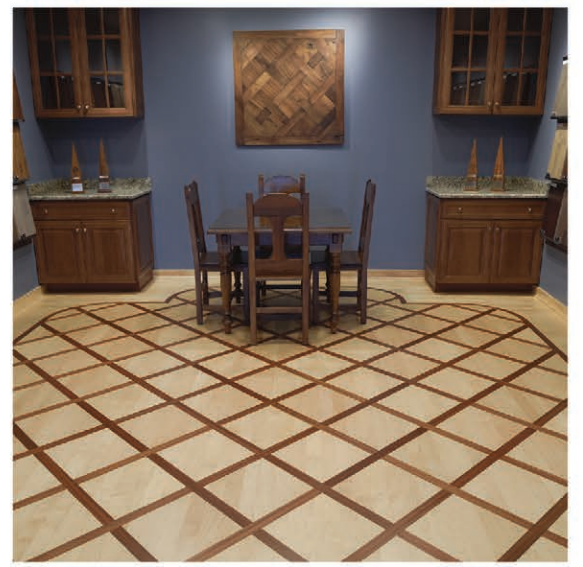
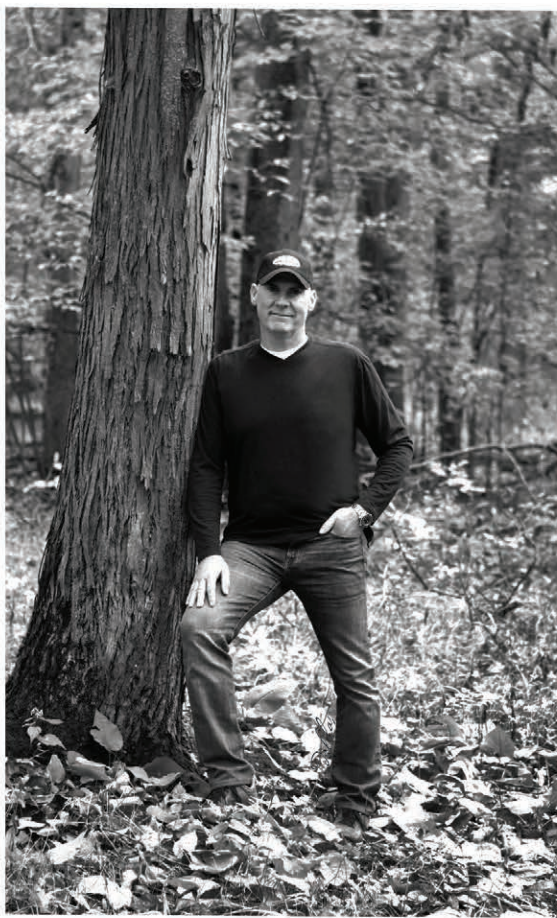
