



Ellicottville Historical Museum

Documenting How We got to Where We Are

Ellicottville is fortunate to have a museum in the prominent four corners of the village of Ellicottville. It doesn't get any better than that, or so it would seem. The issue at hand with a museum the size of a teacup is that it lacks storage, working room, and no ability to comfortably allow ready access to the museum archives for research by individuals.

Beginning as a display center in 1956, the operation moved to its present, circa 1853 building in the 1970's, later obtaining its official charter by the NYS Board of Regents as a museum in 1992. Tim Brown served as President of the Historical Society until he stepped down in 2014 when Dawn Westfall filled the position.
