If you have noticed allergies arriving earlier than normal, you are not alone. In many parts of the country spring early. means those who suffer from seasonal allergies started feeling miserable early, and experts say this year may be a sign of things to come. Scientists and doctors are more concerned that seasonal allergies may continue to start earlier, last longer, and become more severe over the upcoming decades.

According to the National Phenology Network, parts of the Midwest, as well as New York, have seen record breaking timing, "Parts Midwest, mid-Atlantic, and New York City area this year.






