The See-Zuhr House Now Re-Open

A Bemus Point Icon Lives On



This three-story building, erected in the 1880s, was originally a boarding house. Don See and Zurh Faulkner purchased it in 1960 and converted it into a restaurant on the first floor, while keeping an apartment and offices upstairs. Zuhr retired a few years later, but Don kept the business going, eventually selling it in 1984 to the Shaglas. They made the second floor into a bar with another kitchen and named that part "Shaggy's", now known as "14 Main". (See article, "See-Zurh", page 9.)
