On June 11, 1776, the second Continental Congress convened in Philadelphia, designating a committee of five to create a document to sever ties with England. Thomas Jefferson was chosen to craft the document and after 86 changes, the Declaration of Independence was adopted on July 4, 1776. Copies were distributed, and the full declaration was printed in the news on July 6. 
