Margaret Sanger (1879-1966)

Margaret Sanger, a feminist and women's rights activist, coined the term "birth control." She wrote pamphlets and opened a women's health clinic decades before her biggest achievement—getting the Food and Drug Administration to approve the first oral contraceptive, Enovid, in 1960, six years before her death. In 1921, Sanger founded the American Birth Control League, which later became the **Planned Parenthood Federation** of America. In New York City, she organized the first birth control clinic to be staffed by all-female doctors, as well as a clinic in Harlem which had an all African-American advisory council. She died in 1966 and is widely regarded as a founder of the modern birth control movement.
