Maria Goeppert Mayer was a German-born American theoretical physicist, and Nobel laureate in Physics for proposing the nuclear shell model of the atomic nucleus. She was the second woman to win a Nobel Prize in physics, the first being Marie Curie. In 1986, the Maria Goeppert-Mayer Award for early-career women physicists was established in her honor.

A graduate of the University of Göttingen, Goeppert Mayer wrote her doctoral thesis on the theory of two-photon possible absorption by atoms. At the time, the chances of experimentally verifying her



1906-1972 thesis seemed remote, but the development of the laser in the 1960s

later permitted this. Today, the unit for the two-photon absorption cross section is named the Goeppert Mayer (GM) unit.
