Polyurethane, taking about 1 week to set. Some pieces evolve as they're created depending on the wood grain and other factors. "Each piece of wood is very different, and sometimes the grain of wood dictates the design. This piece for Merle was meant to be, and was consistent from the start."

It took Emily about 200 hours over 6 weeks to create the piece. The wood was gifted to her from a local post man who happened to know of Emily's projects. A British chemist and X-ray crystallographer whose work was central to the understanding of the molecular structures of DNA (deoxyribonucleic acid), RNA (ribonucleic acid), viruses, coal, and graphite.Although her works on coal and viruses were appreciated in her lifetime, Franklin's contributions to the discovery of the structure of DNA were largely unrecognized during her life, for which Franklin has been variously referred to as the "dark lady of DNA". 
