

The year was 1981. Grace Kell was working at the Harness Shop in Ellicottville for Rita McKnight when she was offered the business and building. Ida Minerva Tarbell (1857-1944)

was an American writer, investigative journalist, biographer and lecturer. She was one of the leading muckrakers and reformers of the Progressive Era of the late 19th and early 20th centuries and was a pioneer of investigative journalism. One result largely attributable to Tarbell's work was a Supreme Court decision in 1911 that found Standard Oil in violation of the Sherman Antitrust Act. The Court found that Standard was an illegal monopoly and ordered it broken into 34 separate companies. In recognition of her achievements,



in 2000 Tarbell was inducted into the National Women's Hall of Fame, and two years later she was featured as part of a United States Postal Service stamp series commemorating women journalists. Her history of the Standard Oil Company stands as one of the most important works of journalism in the 20th century.


