

Martin Luther King Jr. was awarded a posthumous spoken word Grammy: He won a Grammy posthumously (Best Spoken Word) for his recording of a 1967 address, "Why I oppose the War in Viet Nam, and in 2012 his "I Have a Dream" speech was inducted into the Grammy Hall of Fame. 





# **Report on the Resort**

"Skiing in Ellicottville on the 4th of July?"



Essentially, as the picture shows, these new guns create a super-chilled environment within a securely enclosed space that looks like a trailer. They have wide hoses that protrude from these micro-climate structures which pour out snow onto the hill. In other words, traditional snow guns rely on colder temps (usually below 28 degrees) to shoot out water which forms artificial snow crystals as it hits the colder air. These new machines, on the other hand, create the cold climate within the structure and then shoot out artificial snow. 

Business Opportunity: This next prime contract being bid by the US-DOE Environmental Cleanup Program for Phase 1B at the WVDP is estimated to be used for up to 10 years with an estimated budget between \$1B-\$3B depending on final scope and funding allocations.

The next contract affords the opportunity to generate local business opportunities and jobs to sustain economic development in our communities.

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is seeking a contractor for the continuation of Phase 1B Deactivation and Demolition (D&D) and Soil Remediation activities to be performed at the DOE West Valley Demonstration Project (WVDP) Site in western New York state. The major elements of scope include, but are not limited to: Removal of the below-grade portion of the Main Plant Process Building (MPPB), Vitrification Facility (VF), Ancillary Support Building, and the remediation of soils within Waste Management Area (WMA)-1; Removal of the Radioactive



Waste Water Treatment System, including the lagoons, and remediation of the soils within WMA-2; maintenance of the Remote Handled Waste Facility (RHWF); operation and maintenance (O&M) of the of Reservoir, Spillway & Rail Line; management of the Permeable Treatment Wall (PTW); management of the High Level Waste Canister Interim Storage Facility; management of the Waste Tank Farm; management of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) Licensed Disposal Area; Waste Management and handling of nuclear materials; Safeguards and Security (S&S); Environmental, Safety, Health, and Quality Assurance (ESH&QA) requirements and business administration; and day-to-day operations, maintenance, and repair of designated facilities, systems, and equipment. The West Valley Demonstration Project is a unique operation within the Department of Energy. It came into being through the West Valley Demonstration Project Act of 1980. The Act requires that the Department is responsible for solidifying the high-level waste, disposing of waste created by the solidification, and decommissioning the facilities used in the process. The land and facilities are not owned by the Department. Rather, the project premises are the property of the New York State Energy Research and Development Authority (NYSERDA) and represents only 200 acres of the larger Western New York Service Center, which is approximately 3,300 acres, also owned by NYSERDA. After DOE's responsibilities under the Act are complete, the Act requires that the premises be returned to New York State.

Until that time, the Act requires New York State to pay 10 percent of the Project costs, and the Department pays the remaining 90 percent.
