Most Complicated **Doll** House

Called called "Elsa's house" It was crafted in 1913, by John Carlsson for his younger sister, this elaborate Swedish fourstoried doll house featured a functioning elevator made out of the metal innards of a clock, and electric lighting in all its rooms. It also housed a telephone that rang, a mini typewriter, sewing machine, a chandelier, and 30 dolls. When the house was finally completed, Elsa was adult and no more interested. John Carlsson lived in Stockholm in the capital of Sweden. The dollhouse was probably in demand because he built some more. One of them is in Italy and one at the Nordic Museum in Stockholm and one in the USA.
