

Corey Wiktor, Executive of the CCIDA, provided a glimpse at what 2024 brought to the area, and looks forward to what's to come in 2025. "It was such an exciting year for our area," says "We have so Corey. great projects many happening, multimillion investments dollar that will make such an incredible difference in strengthening the economy of our county."

One of their largest investments of nearly \$1 billion dollars since its groundbreaking was The Great Lakes Cheese project, brining economic Franklinville/ to the Farmersville area. "This project was a game changer for this area." explains Corey. "It helps the area on multiple fronts, from an economic and agricultural standpoint." The factory is looking to start full operations making cheese this December, opening up 200+ jobs to the area. It's the largest private sector development in the state.
