

Ollie and Marcy Hazard Enjoying HoliMont for Six Decades!

HoliMont has some consecutive lucky numbers: 63, 64, 65, 66. Those were the years that charter HoliMont members Ollie and Marcy Hazard fell in love with each other and with HoliMont. In the Fall of 1963, HoliMont founder Bill Merk met Ollie at his fledging new club to show off the recently cut slopes. Impressed, Ollie sold a boat to raise the \$685 he needed to become a member and acquire a building lot on the hill. Ollie reminisces that the first HoliMont lift was operating by the end of the season, and he began his remarkable continuous streak of skiing 61 years in a row at HoliMont! In 1964, Ollie and Marcy met each other while enjoying the summer at Crystal Beach, Ontario.
