New York & Lake Erie Railroad **History and Events of Unique Station**

The New York & Lake Erie Railroad has been in operation since 1978, offering some of the most unique railroad features in the area. What was once a freight train line is now operating as a passenger train railroad for events and unique experiences with 92 events this year alone.

This branch of the New York and Lake Erie Railroad was founded 47 years ago operating as a freight train line with stops in Gowanda, Cattaraugus, Waterboro near Kennedy and Salamanca. Over the years, portions of the railroad were sold off as it became less operational. The Little Valley to Salamanca line became the Pat McGee Trail while other areas fell into disrepair. 'The railroad went through many transitions,' explains Mel Shaw, Customer Relations Specialist for the Railroad. "It was once very







> He also reflected that many of the used jackets would have wound up in dark closets or rarely used drawers, but now they were being repurposed in a meaningful way. On seeing the abject poverty, Tom said "It doesn't take much to enhance someone's life." Yes. there are also people in our own back yard that sometimes need a helping hand, but as Mark Twain famously said, "Travel is fatal to prejudice, bigotry, and narrow-mindedness." 
